south-east side of the length of road which extends along the north-west boundary of Bovey Tracey Town Hall from its junction with Town Hall Place (eastern section) for a distance of 2 metres in a

south-westerly direction.

(2) To leave your vehicle for a longer period than 1 hour (no return within 1 hour) between the hours of 9 a.m. and 6 p.m., Monday to Saturday inclusive in the following lengths of road:

Mary Street, south-west side, from a point 44 metres north-west of its junction with Town Hall Place (western section) for a distance of 23 metres in a north-westerly direction.

Orchard Terrace, west side, from a point 5 metres north of its junction with Fore Street for a distance of 42 metres in a northerly direction (to end of Terrace).

The existing prohibition of waiting at any time in the following length of road will be revoked:

Orchard Terrace

east side, from a point 5 metres north of its junction with Fore Street for a distance of 7 metres in a northerly direction; west side, from a point 5 metres north of its junction with Fore Street for a distance of 13 metres in a northerly direction

The following lengths of roads where waiting is at present limited to 30 minutes will be subject to limited waiting for 1 hour (no return within 1 hour) between the hours of 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. Monday to Saturday inclusive:

Fore Street

south-east side, from a point 46 metres south of the south side of the entrance of South View northwards for a distance of 9 metres; south-east side, from the south side of the entrance to South View southwards for a distance

of 28 metres;

south-east side from a point 109 metres north of the south side of the entrance to South View northwards for a distance of 10 metres.

Town Hall Place, south-east side of the length of road which extends along the north-west boundary of Bovey Tracey Town Hall from a point 2 metres north-east of its junction with Town Hall Place (western section) for a distance of 10 metres in a north-easterly direction.

Union Square, north-west side, from its junction with Fore Street south-westwards for a distance of 31 metres.

Exemptions in the Order permit waiting for the purpose of loading and unloading, boarding and alighting, Post Office services, maintenance of the road, supply of gas, water and electricity, pursuance of statutory powers or duties, taking in petrol, oil or air fom a garage. The statutory exemptions for disabled persons' vehicles are statutory included.
