E have Advice from Rome, that the Palace in swhich Queen Christina liv'd forof the Electoral Prince of Saxony, but his Highness designs to stay in this Place for some Weeks longer. Several of the Servants of the Marquis de Prie, the Emperor's Ambassador, arrived there, and his Excellency having receiv'd the Sum of a hundred thoufand Florins at Milan, is shortly expected.
