

# The London Gazette.

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Portsmouth, Aug. 23.

**Y**esterday were launched here out of the Dry Dock the *Glocester* and *Adventure*, having been both refitted, and near new built from the Keel. This day came in to their Roomes the *Princess* and *Tyger* to be also refitted.

*Warsaw, August 6.* As yet the Discord and Misapprehensions are not reconciled between *Wisniewsky* and *Sobietzky*, though many endeavors have been used for that purpose. Letters from the Army inform us, that some of the Principal of the discontented Great ones, have got together a considerable Sum of Moneys, hoping for an Opportunity to raise Soldiers for their defence, and have Endeavoured to draw some of the Officers of the Army to their Party. A Colonel of the Army having treated *Sobietzky* at a Banquet, one of his Friends and Party began in his Discourse, to touch severely upon the Kings Honour, which so much Incensed the Company, that they fell upon him and lustily Cudgeld him, whereupon *Sobietzky*, privately withdrew for his own security.

The Commissioners from *Dorofensko* have begun to treat, but tis believed this negotiation will not have any Considerable effect, the Tartars appearing his Enemies, and we have now a warm Report, that those of them which came lately out from the *Black Forrest*, and took up their Quarters upon the *Borishnens*, are since Entred upon the Territories of *Poland*, with some of the Turkish Companies; and that the Bassa of *Silistria* who resides at *Bialogrod*, is Ordered to give them his assistance.

The *Czar* of *Muscovy*, as an Argument of his desire to maintain a good Correspondency with this Crown, has been pleased to Communicate to His Majesty a Copy of a Treaty lately made with one of the Neighbouring Princes. The Heer *Heinfus* Envoy from the States of the United Provinces, has some hopes of a good Effect of his Negotiation, *Nassokin* the Great Minister of State having promised him a dispatch from that Court in Order to his return home; and tis said the Great Duke intends to send a Publick Minister into *Holland*.

Some of the Inhabitants upon the Caspian sea, are lately broken out into a Rebellion, whose forces are grown so numerous, that the *Czar* has thought it necessary to give Order for a Considerable Army to march forward to reduce them to Obedience.

They have lately had great storms, with dreadful Thunders and Lightnings, by which three or four of their Towns have been set on fire, amongst others *Faroßlaw* upon the *Volga*, a City of great Trade, and *Rosthom* one of the Archbishopricks of the Country, are wholly ruined.

*Genova, August 9.* The 5th instant arrived here Mr *Hamilton* and Mr *Savile* Envoyes from their Majesties of Great Britain, and His Royal Highness the Duke of *York*, to the Great Duke of *Tuscany*, and the same day went hence for *Flo-*

*rence*. The next day arrived here the *New Jerusalem*, in 45 dayes from *Lisbonne*, in 19 from *Cadix*, and 6. from *Narseilles*, confirming the Success of the two English Fregats with their three Convoyes, against the seven *Algier* men of War. This Evening departed hence the *Fame*, in Company of two stout ships of this place, bound for *Evezzi*, and the *America* for *Spain* and *Lisbonne*. The *New Jerusalem* having landed here what Goods she had for this place, put to sea again two dayes since intending for *Leghorne*.

*Legorn, August 11.* The Dutch Convoy is gone from hence, bound for *Messina* and *Venice*.

The 5th instant arrived a French ship from *Scanderoon* and *Cyprus*, and this day the *New Jerusalem* from *Lisbonne*, *Cales*, *Marseilles* and *Genova*. The 7th instant passed by *Pisa*, Mr *Hamilton* and Mr *Savile*, Envoyes from the Court of *England*, to the Great Duke of *Tuscany*, and arrived the next day at *Florence*.

*Venice, August 16.* Letters from *Dalmatia* inform us, that his Excellency the Proveditor General *Barbaro*, having concluded his Progress through that Province, to the great satisfaction of the people, to whom he gave many proofs of his Care, for the due Administration of Justice, and the relief of the Oppressed, was lately arrived at *Zara*, from whence he had sent out a Caich to recall a Gally which was employed against the Corsairs of *Dulcigno*, upon whose arrival, his Excellency Embarked himself for *Spalato*, for the adjoustring of some affairs relating to the Trade of that place, which is very considerably improved. The Lazarets and Custom houses are already furnished, and Officers appointed to attend them; the Merchants begin already to Trade thither, where is daily also expected a Carravan from *Bosfina*.

The Gally *Brassana* which arrived here this last week, is suddenly to put to sea again for *Dalmatia*, The Officers expecting only Moneys for the payment of their men, together with a Considerable Sum, which is to be intrusted to their Care, for the affairs of *Dalmatia*.

Several of the Nobility intend to go on board her, and to pass over to their Employments in *Dalmatia*, but his Excellency Segnior *Gio. Morosini* has for a longer time deferred his Voyage, to the Exercise of his Charge of Proveditor to the *Armata*.

The Segnions *Tron* and *Molini* are lately put to Sea upon the *Sampson* bound for *Zant*, carrying with them 40. thousand Ducats, which are to be Employed for the Service of the Fleet, and with them are sayled several other ships, with necessaries for the said Fleet.

Several persons arriving here from the *Levant* inform us, that the Visier is much pressed by the Grand Segnior, to use his Endeavors for the speedy Composure of all Disputes in *Constantinople*.

Great Numbers of Masons and Carpenters are lately sent from *Constantinople*, to *Candia*, for the building up the houses both in that City and the Neighbouring Towns, which begin to be filled with Inhabitants, but no Christians are permitted

to dwell in any of their Cities or fortified places.

*Vienna, Aug 16.* The Emperor is designing to fortify the Island near this City, to the end that upon any irruption of the Turks the Country people may repair thither, as to a place of Refuge and Strength, and at the same time be in readiness to be employed for the Defence of this Place.

A Quarrel had like to have lately happened here between the *Venetian* Ambassador and the *French* Resident; The Ambassador's coachman, having in a Publick place affronted the Residents Coach, but the Nuncio interposing, persuaded the said Ambassador, to make an excuse for the rudeness of his Servant.

The Castle of *Muran* is the only place that at present opposes the Imperial Forces, about two or 300. Soldiers being within it, who seem resolved to defend it to the uttermost; but the reduction of this place is not like to be the work of many dayes, nor an Employment for the whole Army, a considerable part whereof will be sent to quarter in the hereditary Countries, and the rest to be distributed into the several Garrisons in *Hungary*.

*Dantzic, August 16.* Most of the lesser Diets in *Poland* are ended with good effect, the Nobility are preparing to be present at the General Assembly, but most of them Armed for the security of their persons.

The Treasurer *Mörstein* intended to go suddenly to *Warsaw*, and to rely upon the Kings Mercy, to which he is encouraged by some Letters from the Court, which tell him, that the King had refused to consent to his Citation, till after the due and formal proceeding of the Senate. The same Letters tell us, that the great Chancellor is going to *Warsaw*, intending to use his endeavours to persuade the King to as much moderation as is possible, the better to win all parties to his Obedience, but the Primate still estranges himself from the Court, endeavouring to insule his Principles into the lesser Diets, to persuade them that the King took his Oath with a mental Reservation, and advising the Palatinates to stand upon their Guards, since their Liberties were like to lie at stake, in the approaching Assembly. Many Libels have been also scattered abroad to the same purpose, as also to defame several persons of great quality.

*Hague, Aug. 29.* We have been much surpris'd and alarmed this last week with the news of the sudden march of the French forces towards *Flanders*, which are ordered to Rendezvous at *Peronne* the 27th instant, we not being able as yet to guess for what service they may be designed; this has at present put a stop to the Reforme, which was intended amongst the forces belonging to the States, and given the States occasion to Command all Officers to repair to their respective Charges.

On Tuesday last arrived here his Excellency the Earl of *Essex*, with his Lady and part of his Train on his return from his Embassy into *Denmark*, who may depart upon the first news of the arrival of the Yacht which is expected for his transportation into *England*.

*Don Francisco de Melo*, the Portugal Ambassador is suddenly designed for *England*, and some other Minister is to be sent hither in his room. Our Letters from *Portugal* inform us, that some disputes have happened between the Portugais Officers and the ships which were ordered to lade Salt there according to agreement.

*Don Estevan de Gamarra*, the Spanish Ambassador is suddenly expected here to take his leave of the States, but as yet we know not what person will be ordered to succeed him.

On Tuesday last the States received Letters from the Prince *de Tarente*, acknowledging the civilities he received from them, and freely resigning into their hands his Government of *Boisleduc*, to which tis believed the Marshal *Wurtz* may be preferred.

The Heet *de Groot* has by reason of his indisposition and fits of the Gout, been obliged to make many halts on his way to *France*; he was the 24th instant at *Ghent*, but intended the next day to set forwards; and in five days to reach *Amiens*. The States have thought fit to send him new instructions.

Yesterday arrived here the Prince of *Orange* from *Biren*, having on his way touched at *Breda*, and intends shortly to divert himself for some time in *Realand*.

Monseigneur *de Gioe* Envoy from his Majesty of *Denmark* has received Orders to continue for a longer time here, till the arrival of the Count *Anthony d'Oldembourg*, who is designed hither with the Character of Ambassador Extraordinary from that Crown.

The Resident from the *Hans Towns* has lately presented a Memorial to the States to desire their Letters of intercession to His Majesty of Great *Britain*, on the behalf of the City of *Hambourg*, to prevent the execution of Letters of Reprisals for reparation of the Merchants for the losses sustained by the burning of their ships in the *Elbe*, where they expected protection in the late wars.

*Paris, August 30.* The Marquis *de St Andre Montbrun*, has had his Audience from His Majesty and been received with much kindness.

On the 27th instant the Army was drawn up before His Majesty in the Plain of *Ouilles*, and yesterday began to remove from the Camp and to march away towards their Rendezvous at *Peronne*.

We have here a confident report that the Duke of *Lorraine* is retired from *Nancy*, which is now possess'd by his Majesties forces drawn out of the Bishopricks of *Toul, Metz* and *Verdun*, of which we expect a Confirmation.

The 17th instant the Marquis *de Marrel* Lieutenant General of the Naval Forces, returned with a Squadron of 6 men of War to *Thoulon*, having for above four Months been Employed before *Tunis* and *Guletta*, whither the Count *de Vivonne* is to be sent with a Squadron of seven other ships to lye before the same places to keep in check the Corsairs.

The Sieur *Nointel* Ambassador to the Ottoman Court, was to Embark the 18th instant at *Thoulon* with the Turkish Envoy, upon four men of War designed for the *Levant*.

*Whitehal, August 24.* On Monday last His Majesty and Royal Highness went hence to divert themselves for some time at *Windsor*, and the same day Her Majesty and Royal Highness went hence to *Hampton*, where they intend to continue during the Kings absence.
