### DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORT

*The York-Hull Trunk Road (A1079) (Hull City Boundary Ings Bridge Roundabout) (Clearway) Order 1984*

1. The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 1(1), (2), (3) and (3B) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of which is to prohibit waiting in any part of the York-Hull Trunk Road (A1079) in the District of Beverley in the County of Humberside (known locally as Beverley Road, Hull) which extends from the Hull City Boundary to its junction with the A1174 (including the roundabout at that junction; a distance of approximately 550 metres as measured along the said length of road. The Order comes into operation on 13th July 1984.

The prohibition imposed by the Order shall not apply:

- (a) to a vehicle waiting upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a traffic warden;
- (b) so as to prevent a vehicle from being used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the trunk road or of any of the services therein;
- (c) to a vehicle being used for fire brigade, police or ambulance services;
