TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

TOWN AND COUNTRY GENERAL REGULATIONS 1976

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he has made an Order entitled "The Conversion of Highways into Footpaths or Bridleways (District of Bradford) (No. 2) Order 1984". The Order comes into operation 18th July 1984 and extinguishes any right which persons may have to use vehicles (other than those specified in Schedule 2 to the Order) on lengths of Marsh Street and Hastings Street, and an unnamed highway off Smiddles Lane in the Marshfields General Improvement Area, Bradford.

Copies of the Order may be obtained, free of charge, by applying to the Director (Transport), Yorkshire and Humberside Region, Room 911, City House, New Station Street, Leeds

LS1 4JD, (quoting Ref. No.: 5111/41/7/30) and may be inspected at all reasonable hours at the offices of the Group Engineer (Roads), City of Bradford Metropolitan Council, Jacobs Well, Bradford BD1 5RW and at the Central Library, Prince's Way, Bradford BD1 5RW.

If any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question its validity, or the validity of any provision contained in it, on the ground that it is not within the powers conferred by the above Act or that any requirement of that Act or of any regulations made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he or she may, within 6 weeks from 18th July 1984 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained in it.

Unless the Order is suspended or quashed as a consequence of any such application, any person who on 18th July 1984 has an interest in land having lawful access to a highway to which the Order relates may claim to be entitled to be compensated by the City of Bradford Metropolitan Council in respect of any depreciation in the value of his or her interest which is directly attributable to the Order and of any other loss or damage which is so attributable. Any claim must be served on the Council at its above address within a period of 6 months from 18th July 1984, unless the period is extended in any particular case by the Secretary of State.

### NORTH WEST WATER AUTHORITY

#### DROUGHT ACT 1976

#### WATER ABSTRACTION FROM ULLSWATER

Notice is given that North West Water Authority have applied to the Secretary of State for an Order under section 1 of the Drought Act 1976 to modify for a temporary period not extending beyond 31st January 1985, the restrictions to which their abstraction of water from Ullswater is presently subject as follows:

At present, the Authority are authorised by Manchester (Ullswater and Windermere) Water Order 1966 to abstract water from Ullswater at their intake near Gale Bay. No abstraction can, however, take place unless the flows in the River Eamont immediately below Pooley Bridge exceed the figures for each month as set out in the schedule below and in any case, unless the water level in Ullswater is at least 475.6 feet above ordnance datum (Liverpool).

The quantity of water the Authority is authorised to abstract is not more than 80 million gallons per day, provided the

quantity abstracted in any period of 12 consecutive months shall not exceed 10,038 million gallons.

This application is to modify temporarily these conditions and to authorise the Authority as follows:

- To construct and maintain a temporary weir or weirs across the River Eamont near Pooley Bridge sufficient to raise the water level in Ullswater to 476.0 feet above ordnance datum (Liverpool).
- To abstract up to 80 million gallons per day from Ullswater at their intake near Gale Bay, provided the flow in the River Eamont at Pooley Bridge is not less than 10 million gallons per day.
- To disregard the overall limitation of 10,038 million gallons in any period of 12 consecutive months in respect of all the water abstracted during the period of the Order.
