Whereas fince the Abolithing of Epifcopal Govern-ment in Scotland, thole of the Epifcopal Perfua-fion there, have been frequently Diffunded and In-terrupted in their Religions Affembles, and their Minifters Profecuted for Reading the Englift Service in their Congre-gations, and for Adminiftring the Sacraments, according to the Form and Manner preferibed in the Liturgy of the Church of England, Be ir therefore Enacted by the Queen's moth Excellent Majelty, by and with the Advice and Con-fent of the Lords Spiratual and Temporal, and the Commons in this prefer Parliament Affembled, and by the Authority of the fame, That it fhall be Free and Lawiul for all thole of the Epifcopal Communion, in that part of Grat Britanian called Scotland, to Meet and Affemble for the Exercise of Divine Worfhup, to be performed after their own Manner by Paftors Ordined by a Proteftant Bifhop, and who are not Effablifhed Minifters et any Church or Paufh, and to Ufe in their Congregations the Liturgy of the Church of England, if they think ht, without any Let, Hindiance, or Diffurnance from any Perfor whatfoever, And all sheriffs of schires, Stewards of Stewartries, and Magiffrates of Bo-roughs, and Juffices of the Peace, are hereby friftly Re-quire to give all manner of Protection, Aid, and Affittance to fich Epifcopal Minifters, and thole of their own Com-munion, in their Meetings and Affembleic for the Worfhip on God, held in any Town or Place, except Parifh-Churches, Mithin the Extent and Juridiction of that part of Great Bri-rain called Scotland.

Fina Called Scotiana. Provided always, and be it Enafted by the Authority afore-faid, That none fhall profume to Exercise the Function of a Pastor in the faid Episcopal Meetings and Congregations, ex-cept fluch as shall have received Holy Orders from the Hands

Paflo, That hone that picture to Exercise the function of a Paflor in the faid Epifopal Weetings and Congregations, ex-cept fuch as fhall have received Holy Orders from the Hands of a Proteftant Bifhop; and that every Perfon who fhall be called or appointed to be a Paftor or Minifter of any Epif-copal Congregation or Alfembly, before ha take upon him to Officiate as Paftor of the faid Congregation, be hereby Oblig,d and Required to prefent his Letters or Orders to the Littices of Peace, at their General or Quarter-Sellions, to be heid for the Shire, Stewartry, City, Town, or other place in which the faid Epifopal Congregation is or fhall be; and that the faid Letters of Orders be there Entered on Record by the Register or Clerk of the faid Meeting of the Juffices, for which there fhall be no greater Fee or Reward taken that the Sum of One Shilling.
