MID GLAMORGAN COUNTY COUNCIL

Mid Glamorgan County Council (Merchant Street (Part) Pontlottyn) (Prohibition and Limitation of Waiting) (Variation) Order 1984.

Notice is hereby given that the Mid Glamorgan County Council propose to make an Order under sections 1 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, the effect of which will be to vary the "Mid Glamorgan County Council (Various Streets, Pontlottyn) (Revocation, Prohibition and Limitation of Waiting) Order 1980" so that:

- (1) Article 4 thereof (which prohibits the waiting of vehicles at any time on the lengths of roads or on the sides of lengths of roads specified in Schedule 1 to the said Order) shall apply to the eastern side of Merchant Street (A469) Pontlottyn from a point opposite the northern boundary of No. 30 Merchant Street, southwards to a point 15 metres (16 yards) north of the northern side of its junction with Stuart Street, a distance of approximately 54 metres (55 yards).
- (2) Article 5 thereof (which prohibits the waiting of vehicles for a period exceeding 30 minutes with return prohibited within 1 hour between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. Monday to Saturday (inclusive) on the sides of lengths of road specified in Schedule 11 to the said Order) shall no longer apply to the side of length of road detailed in the Schedule to this notice.

Exemptions will be provided in the Order for the purposes of boarding, alighting, loading and unloading, buildings and roadworks, the maintenance of essential services, weddings, funerals and the delivery or collection of postal packets by vehicles in the service of the Post Office. Disabled persons' vehicles displaying the relevant disabled person's badge will be allowed to wait for up to 2 hours with return prohibited within 1 hour in respect of item (1) above.

- (i) The north-western side of Garth Street, Morgantown, Merthyr Tydfil, from the south-western side of its junction with Brecon Road (A4102), south-westwards to the north-eastern side of its junction with Moriah Street, a distance of approximately 61 metres (67 yards).
- (ii) The south-eastern side of Garth Street, Morgantown, Merthyr Tydfil, from the south-western side of its junction with Brecon Road (A4102), south-westwards for a distance of 15 metres (16 yards).
- (iii) The south-western side of David Street, Merthyr Tydfil, from the north-western side of its junction with Garth Street, north-westwards to the south-eastern side of its junction with Upper Edward Street, a distance of approximately 32 metres (35 yards).

- (vi) The south-eastern side of Lower Edward Street, Morgantown, Merthyr Tydfil, from the south-western side of its junction with Moriah Street, south-westwards to the south-western side of its junction with Sand Street, a distance of approximately 24 metres (26 yards).
- (vii) The north-western side of Lower Edward Street, Morgantown, Merthyr Tydfil, from the south-western side of its junction with William Street, south-westwards to the north-eastern side of its junction with Sand Street, a distance of approximately 24 metres (26 yards).
- (viii) The south-western side of William Street, Morgantown, Merthyr Tydfil, from the north-western side of its junction with Lower Edward Street, north-westwards to the south-eastern side of its junction with Cambrian Street, a distance of approximately 38 metres (41 yards).
- (ix) The north-eastern side of Sand Street, Morgantown, Merthyr Tydfil, from the north-western side of its junction with Lower Edward Street, north-westwards to the south-eastern side of its junction with Cambrian Street, a distance of approximately 38 metres (41 yards).
