- (d) a route for a slip road to connect the north-westbound carriageway of the London-Canterbury-Dover Trunk Road with the realigned Old Dover Road.
- (2) An Order under section 14 of the Highways Act 1980 authorising him, east of Barham aforesaid:
  - (a) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter highways,
