(2) a vehicle being used for the conveyance of persons to or from a wedding or funeral at Salem Independent Methodist Church, Scotland Road, Nelson;
(3) a vehicle being used for the conveyance of goods or persons to or from Salem Independent Methodist Church between the hours of 4 p.m. and 10 a.m. on Monday to Saturday and at any time on Sunday;
(4) a vehicle being used in connection with building

(4) a vehicle being used in connection with building demolition and public utilities;

(5) a vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes.

The Council is satisfied that for avoiding danger to persons using the aforementioned lengths of road it is requisite for section 1 (5) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, should not apply in relation to this Order.
