The Islington (Prescribed Route) (No. 5) Experimental Traffic Order 1984

Notice is hereby given that the Greater London Council on 13th August 1984 made the above-mentioned Order under section 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by the Transport Act 1968 and the Road Traffic Act 1974 and as modified by the Greater London Council (General Powers) Act 1974.

- 2. The effect of the Order will be to impose one-way working for vehicular traffic from south-east to north-west in Britannia Row.
- 3. Exemption has been provided in the Order in respect of anything done:
 - (a) with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform;
 - (b) in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed on the highway by or on behalf of the Metropolitan Police.
- 4. The Order provides that in pursuance of section 9 (5) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, the Council's Chief Traffic Engineer, or some person authorised in that behalf by him, may if it appears to him or that person essential in the interests of the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of traffic or for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which any road affected by the Order runs, modify or suspend the Order or any provision thereof.
- 5. A copy of the Order, which will come into operation on 25th August 1984, and of the Council's statement of reasons for making the Order can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, until

the expiration of a period of 6 months from that date, in Room B.72, The County Hall, London SE1 7PB.

- 6. Copies of the Order may be obtained from the Transportation and Development Department, Room 301, South Block, The County Hall, London SE1 7PB.
- 7. Any person desiring to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the ground that it is not within the powers of the relevant section of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 or on the ground that any requirement of that section of the Act or of section 84A, 84B or 84C of the Act or of any regulations made under the said section 84C has not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
- 8. If the provisions of the Order continue in operation for a period of not less than 6 months, the Council will consider in due course whether the provisions of the Order should be reproduced and continued in force indefinitely by means of an Order under section 6 of the said Act of 1967. Any person desiring to object to the making of the Order under section 6 of the said Act of 1967 for the purpose of such reproduction and continuation in force may, within the afore-mentioned period of 6 months, send a statement in writing of their objection and the grounds thereof to the Controller of Transportation and Development, The County Hall, London SE1 7PB, quoting ref. TD/T/LS.
