2. The general effect of the Order would be further to amend the Tower Hamlets (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1976, so that in the service road fronting Poplar Municipal Offices, Bow Road—

(a) waiting by vehicles (otherwise than for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle) would be prohibited between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive;

(b) waiting by vehicles for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle for a period of more than 20 minutes in the same place would be prohibited between 11 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive;

(c) the sale or offer for sale of goods from a vehicle would be prohibited, except on a Sunday, unless there is in force a valid licence issued by the Tower Hamlets Borough Council or the goods are immediately taken into or delivered at premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is effected;

(d) the use of any vehicle or of any animal or the wearing of fancy dress or other costume, wholly or mainly for the purpose of advertising, would be prohibited.

3. The prohibitions referred to in paragraph 2 (a) and (b) above would not apply in respect of anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform or in certain circumstances, e.g., the picking up or setting down of passengers; the carrying out of statutory powers or duties; the taking in of petrol, etc., from roadside petrol stations; to licensed street traders, etc. The usual exemption relating to vehicles displaying a disabled person's "Orange Badge" would apply.
