(ii) between Blandford Street and Thayer Street, from north-west to south-east;

- (d) Nottingham Place, between Paddington Street and Nottingham Street, from south-east to north-west;
- (e) Nottingham Street, between Nottingham Place and Marylebone High Street, from south-west to northeast
- (f) Paddington Street, between Marylebone High Street and Nottingham Place, from north-east to southwest
- (g) Thayer Street, between Marylebone High Street and a point 4.5 metres north-east of the south-eastern kerb-line of George Street, from north-west to southeast.
