RATES OF INTEREST ON LOANS BY THE PUBLIC WORKS LOAN COMMISSIONERS TO LOCAL AUTHORITIES

NOTICE

TREASURY MINUTE dated 26th September 1984.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury read section 3 (2) of the National Loans Act 1968 (1968 c. 13 as amended) whereby any sums borrowed from the Public Works

Loan Commissioners shall bear interest at such rates as the Treasury may determine from time to time in accordance with section 5 of the said Act.

My Lords understand that the Public Works Loan Commissioners will be operating arrangements under which local authorities are permitted to borrow from the Commissioners up to a specified quota at a certain fixed rate of interest and in excess of such quota at one of two higher fixed rates.

In accordance therewith the Chancellor of the Exchequer now recommends that with effect from 26th September 1984 and until the coming into operation of a further determination;

I. The rate of interest applicable to any such fixed rate loan will be that in force on the day the authority applies to borrow or, if the application is before noon three working days before the loan is credited to the account of the authority's banker, the rate in force at 11 a.m. two banking days before credit day;

II. Different rates of interest shall be charged on such fixed rate loans according to whether the principal of a loan is repaid by instalments or at maturity and, if repaid by instalments, whether by equal instalments of the principal with interest paid on the decreasing balance of the principal (E.I.P.), or by instalments of equal repayments of the principal and interest paid thereon (E.R.);

PWLB Non-quota B Rate loans will bear interest at 1 per cent above the corresponding Non-quota "A" rates.

The amount which a local authority borrows within its annual quota will bear interest at the appropriate rate in the quota set of rates. Authorities may borrow further sums at quota rates at the discretion of the Public Works Loan Commissioners. Other borrowing, beyond the quota entitlement will be at the appropriate rate in the non-quota set of rates.

My Lords concur.

The Secretary of State, in exercise of his powers under section 11 (1) (a) of the Competition Act 1980, hereby refers to the Monopolies Commission the questions set out below relating to the efficiency and costs of the British Railways Board in its property activities.

For the purposes of this reference:

(a) "land" includes buildings on and air space over land; and

(b) "property activities" means activities in the acquisition, management, development and disposal of land, whether or not owned by the Board, but excluding land forming part of the estate of any enterprise of the Board or of any of its subsidiaries which is an enterprise whose proposed sale has been announced.

The Commission shall upon this reference investigate and report on the following questions:

(i) whether the Board could improve its efficiency and thereby reduce its costs in the exercise of its property activities, with particular reference to:

(a) the criteria according to which and procedures by which decisions are taken in the exercise of those activities, including the criteria according to which land is made available for development and/or disposal;

(b) the scope for development and/or disposal of land in respect of which it exercises those activities;

(c) the scope for increased private sector finance for and participation in those activities;

(d) its policy in relation to charges made in the exercise of those activities;

(e) the Board's internal management information systems including those for attributing to a particular part of the enterprise of the Board and its subsidiaries the cost of land used in that part;

(f) whether the present manner of exercise by the Board of those activities and relationship between that exercise and the exercise of the other activities of the Board and its subsidiaries is in the best financial interest of the Board and its subsidiaries taken as a whole;

(g) the scope for increased commercial use of sites on stations; and

(h) its policy in relation to and management of non-operational land which, by reason of its physical characteristics or location, has little or no development potential; and

(ii) whether, in relation to any matter falling within the question set out above, the Board is pursuing a course of conduct which operates against the public interest.

The Commission shall report upon these references within a period of 6 months beginning on the date hereof.

They should be in writing and should state the title of the order. In the case of objections, the grounds on which they are made should also be stated.

3. This Order may be cited as the Carnkief Pond (Cornwall) Nature Conservation Order 1984.

Lowland heathland at Carnkief Pond in the Parish of Perranzabuloe and County of Cornwall containing 2 hectares or thereabouts and shown hatched and edged black on the map annexed hereto.

SCHEDULE 2

Specified Operations

- (i) Cultivation including ploughing, rotovating, harrowing or reseeding.
- (ii) Application of any chemical, organic or inorganic fertiliser, herbicide or pesticide.
- (iii) Dumping, spreading or discharge of any materials.
- (iv) The destruction, whether by burning or otherwise, displacement, removal or cutting of any plant or plant remains, including tree, shrub, herb, hedge, dead or decaying wood, moss lichen, fungus, leaf-mould, turf.

(v) Drainage (including moor-gripping and the use of mole, tile, tunnel or artificial drains).

(vi) Construction, removal or destruction of roads, tracks, walls, fences, hardstands, banks, ditches or other earthworks, or the laying, maintenance or removal of pipelines and cables, above or below ground.

2. This Order would be introduced as soon as the new road east of the Buttercross is opened, and its effect would be as follows:

- (a) to impose a one-way system in the Order area, with entry (as at present) by the Town Hall and exit via a temporary roadway across the car park onto the main carriageway of Market Square south of No. 49 ("Freshgro");
- (b) to prohibit all vehicles from the remainder of the Order area not forming part of the one-way system;
- (c) to prohibit waiting at all times in the whole of the Order area (which would no longer be available as a car park); and
- (d) to prohibit right turns from the new road east of the Buttercross into the entry to the Order area by the Town Hall.

3. Exemptions from 2 (b) and (c) above are proposed for emergency vehicles and vehicles needing access for statutory purposes (e.g. repairs to services) and to enable the Stalls Market to continue to operate. There would be an exemption from 2 (b) to permit the setting down and picking up of passengers, but waiting for the purpose of loading or unloading goods (except in connection with the Market) would not be permitted in any part of the Order area.

Market Square Traffic Regulation (No. 2) Order.

4. This Order would replace the No. 1 Order as soon as rear access becomes available off the new road east of the Buttercross to the parking areas behind Waitrose and the adjoining premises. Its effect would be as follows:

- (a) to retain, as a two-way road, the present roadway along the east side of the Order area, but to restrict its use to vehicles requiring access to premises which would otherwise be altogether inaccessible (i.e. not to the rear parking areas);
- (b) to prohibit all vehicles from the remainder of the Order area (as in 2 (b) above);
- (c) to prohibit waiting throughout the Order area (as in 2 (c) above);
- (d) to prohibit right turns as in 2 (d) above, and also left turns in the opposite direction.

The Greater London (Restriction of Goods Vehicles) Traffic Order 198

Notice is hereby given that the Greater London Council propose to make the above-mentioned Order under section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

2. The general effect of the Order would be to prohibit any goods vehicle the maximum gross weight of which exceeds 16.5 tonnes from being driven on any road in Greater London other than those roads which are specified in the Schedule to this notice, between midnight and 7 a.m. and between 9 p.m. and midnight on Mondays to Fridays inclusive; between midnight and 7 a.m. and between 1 p.m. and midnight on Saturdays and at any time on Sundays.

3. The prohibition referred to in paragraph 2 above would not apply:

- (a) to any vehicle displaying a plate indicating that a permit has been issued by or on behalf of the Greater London Council exempting that vehicle from the prohibition;
- (b) any vehicle authorised by the Motor Vehicles (Authorisation of Special Types) General Order 1979 for use on roads;

- (c) to any vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;
- (d) to any vehicle which or whose load is required to deal with any emergency affecting the safety of persons or property;
- (e) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform; or
- (f) anything done in accordance with any prohibition, restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed on the highway by or on behalf of the City of London Police or the Metropolitan Police.

4. The Order would make provision for the determination of applications for exemption permits in accordance with a policy statement issued by the Council and for the issue and revocation of such permits.
