The Trunk Road (A361) (Various Roads, South Molton, Devon) (One Way Traffic and Prohibition of Waiting, Loading and Unloading) Order 1984.

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Transport proposes to make an Order under sections 1 (1) and (2), and 2 (1), (2) and (3) of, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 on the Taunton-Fraddon Trunk Road (A361) at South Molton in the District of North Devon in the County of

The effect of the Order will be to revoke the Trunk Roads (Various Streets, South Molton, Devon) (One-Way Traffic and Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1968 and to re-enact its provisions subject to certain amendments. These amendments are intended to:

(i) prohibit waiting at any time on:

- (a) four additional sides of East Street,
- (b) those sides of Broad Street which adjoin the new amenity area, and
 - (c) the western end of Broad Street:
- (ii) prohibit waiting at any time and loading and unloading during the working day on a length of the southernmost sides of East Street and Broad Street west of its junction with New Street, which for the most part of its length faces the East Street Island site and the amenity area: and
- (iii) reduce the length of North Road (Union Road) which will be subject to a prohibition of waiting during the working day.

These revisions are aimed at improving the free flow of traffic on the trunk road through South Molton.

The detailed restrictions contained in the Order are as follows:

A. One-way traffic system in Broad Street and East Street. Traffic shall proceed on the roads specified in column 1 of the following table in the directions specified in column 2 of that table.

Column 2 From west to east.

Broad Street and East Street, northern carriageway, from a point 74 metres west of the junction of Broad Street and East Street with Duke Street to a point 45 metres east of that junction.

From east to west.

East Street and Broad Street, southern carriageway, from a point 76 metres west of the junction of New Road with East Street to a point 198 metres west of that junction.

B. Waiting prohibited at all times in:

Union Road, both sides, from a point 121 metres north of its junction with North Street to that junction,

Barnstaple Street, both sides, from its junction with North Street to its junction with Queen Street,

King Street, both sides, from its junction with Queen Street to its junction with Church Street,

Broad Street

North side, from its junction with Church Street to a point 74 metres west of its junction with East Street and Duke Street,

South side, from a point 198 metres west of its junction of East Street with New Road to a point 216 metres west of that junction,
