TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that on the application of the Sheffield Metropolitan District Council, he proposes to make an Order under section 212 of the above Act to provide for the extinguishment of any right which persons may have to use vehicles on a length of Rowsley Street and two unnamed highways, Sheffield.

The proposed Order will contain provisions for permitting the use of these highways by vehicels being used:-

- (a) for police, ambulance or fire brigade purposes;
- (b) on behalf of a statutory undertaker or British Telecommunications and engaged upon the laying, erection, inspection, maintenance, alteration, repair, renewal or removal of any main pipe, conduit, wire, cable or other removal of any main pipe, conduit, wire, cable or other apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984 under, in, on, over, along or across the highway or any land adjacent to the highway; (c) on behalf of a water authority and engaged upon the laying, inspection, maintenance, alteration, repair, revewal or removal of any public sewer under, in, on, over, along or across the highway or any land adjacent to the highway.
