*Lisbon, April 12. N. S.*

**O**UR Troops are marching from their Quarters, in order to their Rendezvous in the Province of Alentejo. A Squadron of British Ships will meet the Portugal Fleet from the Bahía, and Convoy them from the Islands. Two Dutch Men of War are going out with two Portugal East-India Ships, and five Dutch Men of War more are under Sail to Convoy their Storeships to Gibraltar. The King of Portugal's Brother has broke his Leg in Hunting, but it is thought that he is past all danger. This Day arriv'd here the Trade from England.

*Vienna, April 6. N. S.* The Grand Master of the Teutonic Order, who is likewise Coadjutor of Mentz, has taken the accustomed Oaths to the Emperor, in Quality of Governour both of the Upper and Lower Silesia. On the Twenty ninth of the last Month, Fourteen of the Knights of the Golden Fleece, who have been nominated to that Dignity at Frankfort, were Install'd in the Church of the Augustin Friars with extraordinary Solemnity, and receiv'd the Collar of the Order from the Hands of his Imperial Majesty. The Swiss-General, Baron d'Erlagh, is very earnest in his Sollicitations for considerable Arrears due to the Swiss Regiments in the Imperial Service, which are said to amount to Three hundred thousand Crowns. The Venetian Ambassador, Victor Zani, having made a very splendid Entrance the day before, has had his first Audience of the Emperor. His Imperial Majesty has sent back an Interpreter, who lately arriv'd here from Constantinople with a Commission to Monsieur Taalman, who remains there as his Resident, formally to notify his Majesty's Accession to the Imperial Crown, and to distribute the Presents that are usual upon such Occasions. The Prince Esterhasi arriv'd here from Hungary upon the Second of this Month, and has represented to the Emperor, that several of the Senators, and other Members summoned to appear at the General Diet for that King-

dom, to be held at Presburg, come hither daily, but those who pass'd through Places that are in any manner suspected to have the Plague, perform their Quarantine upon the Road, where they expect farther Orders: Hereupon the Emperor Yesterday, commanded the Great Chamberlain to acquaint him, that when they were all arriv'd at Presburg, and the Affairs of the Government in a proper Condition for his Reception, they should give him notice of it: In the mean time there is no day fix'd for his departure, nor are the Persons appointed who should attend him in his Journey thither. Signior Odelschalchi, the Pope's Nuncio is gone hence in his way to Poland. The Velt Marshal, Count Daun, is so much indispos'd, that it is thought he will not be able to make the approaching Campaign in Italy.

*Schaffhausen, April 7. N. S.* Monsieur Pudner, the Chancellor of the Abbot of St. Galle, having met with a Monk of Fishingen, and some other Persons, in the Village of Mosnang in the County of Tockenbourg, assembled the Commons, and made them Propositions on the part of the Prelate his Master; upon which they divided, and part were for accepting them, but others for their rejection, as Captious and Insufficient; at last they came to Blows, and the Chancellor, with his Company, were oblig'd to fly to a Place of Safety, being follow'd by those who had most contributed to the intestine Dissentions. It is hop'd at Zurich, that this small Encounter may occasion the Abbot to defer the execution of his Design, and that some proper Method may be found out for an Accommodation. The General Diet was opened on the Fourth Instant at Baden.

*Cologn, April 12. N. S.* The Chapter of this Place having sent the Baron de Godenau, and Monsieur Veyder, to view the Fortifications of the Town of Bonne, which were said to be in want of Reparations, they have executed their Commissions, but their Report is not as yet made publick. They write from Meurs, that the Prussian Commissaries, at the request of the Magistrates and

and Commander of the Place, have permitted the Country People to carry Provisions thither, but will not suffer them to buy any thing there, or to bring it out of the Town. The Prussian Horſe which Quarter'd laſt Winter in the Lower Dioceſs of Cologn, march'd Yeſterday towards the Meuſe. The Imperial Troops deſign'd for the Low Countries, are on their march, part will paſs the Rhine at Bonne, part at this Place, and the reſt at Mulheim: Yeſterday the Chapter here held an extraordinary Aſſembly upon this occaſion. The Elector of Mentz complains, that all theſe Troops take their Paſſage through his Countries, and none of them towards the Right, thorough the Territory of Fulda; upon which, he has ſent an Expreſs to Vienna. The Elector of Triers was Yeſterday expected from Luneville at Frankfort, to go from thence to Oſnabrug, and in his Paſſage, intended a Viſit to the Biſhop of Paterborn and Munſter at Neuhaufe.

*Plymouth, April 22.* Yeſterday ſail'd Her Maſteſty's Ships the Bonadventure, Fowey, Dunwich, Loe and Garland, with about twenty Merchant Ships, moſt for London.
