HE Troubles in Tockenbourg increase daily, and are far from being brought to any Accommodation. The Abbot of St. Gall has eight thousand Men under Arms, and the Catholick Cantons have taken Resolutions to support him. The Tockenburgers, who have declar'd for the Abbot, continue firm to him, notwithstanding they have been defeated in several Skirmishes, and some of their Leaders been taken and put in Prilon at Lichtensteig. The Forces of the Canton of Zurich, have pillag'd the Town of Riquebac, belorging to the Abbot of St. Gall, who threatens them with Reprifals. The Canton of Berne have fent two Deputies to the three Cantons of Luceine, Fribourg and Solewe, the mot confidenable among those of the Catholicks, to desire them to contribute to the Composure of these Differences by whom they were receiv'd very favourably. How-ever, the Cantons of Lucerne, Ury, Switz, Un-derwalde and Zug, have thought fit to take all nec-stary Precautions, and have order d tie Sub-jects of Zurich and Eerne, who dealt amongst them for Cattle and other Merchandizes, to retire from their Territories in a Days time, upon pain or Denth. They have made divers I ines and Retrenchments on the Frantiers of Zurich and Berre, and rais'd all their I ilitia, and feiz d upon dive s Posts, to secure themselves from any Surprize Among other things, the aforemention'd Cantons have broke down the Bridge upon the Lake of Zurich, and so, by the advantageous stuation of the Town of Mellinghen, of which they are in posfession, will be able to cut off the Communication between Zurich and Berne; whereupon the Forces of Berne have made a Bridge of Boats below Arau to open a Passage into the Country of Bade, which is at present govern d by a Bailist of B rps. Audience of the Pope, in which he has requested the Promotion of Signior Borromeo, as a Person of an Exemplary Life, to the Archbishoprick of Milan, now void by the Death of Cardinal Archinto, by which likewise Seventeen Places in the College of Cardinals are become vacant. Great parations are making in the Chur h de l'Anima, belonging to the German Nation, at Rome, to celebrate the Anniversary of the Emperor Joseph the First, about the beginning of the next Month, the Empress-Mother having remitted Four thoufand Crowns towards defraying the Expences. The Count Taffis, son to the Prince of that Name, is arrived here from Barcelona in his way to Naples. where he is to take Possession of the Charge of Post-Matter Gene al of that Kingdom. He brings an Account of the Empress-Regent's Fealth, and, that fine has given the Mila ese Regiment that is in Catalonia, to the Gereral Marquis Lucini, in Consideration of his Merits, and the brave Defence he made at Ostalric.
