

on waiting by vehicles, on the sale of goods and on advertising activities imposed by the above-mentioned Order of 1976 will be revoked,

(b) in Bisham Gardens, between the south-western kerb-line of Highgate High Street and a point 18.29 metres south-west of that kerb-line, in addition to the existing restrictions on waiting by vehicles, waiting by vehicles for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle will be prohibited between 8 a.m. and 9.30 a.m. and between 5 p.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive.

3 The prohibition referred to in paragraph 2 (b) above will not apply in respect of anything done with permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform, or in certain circumstances, e.g., the picking up or setting down of passengers, the carrying out of statutory powers or duties, the taking in of petrol, etc., from roadside petrol stations, to licensed street traders, etc.

4 A copy of the Order, which will come into operation on 18th February 1985, and of the Camden (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1976 (and of the Orders which have previously amended that Order) can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, until the end of 6 weeks from the date on which the Order was made, in Room B 72, The County Hall, London SE1 7PB.
