Kensington, May 12.

HIS Evening Monfieur de Leith, Envoy Extraordinary from the Czar of Muſcovy, had a Private Audience of Her Majeſty; to which he was introduc'd by the Right Honourable Henry St. John, Eſq; One of Her Majeſty's Principal Secretaries of State, and Conducted by Sir Clement Cottrell, Maſter of the Ceremonies.

Milan, April 30. N. S. His Royal Highnefs the Duke of Savoy has fent for the Contador Intendant General Fontana, one of his Plenipotentiaries here, to make the neceffary Difpofitions in the Valley of Sufa, for Quartering the Troops which he has refolved to fend thither, to oppofe any Enterprizes that may be made by the French, who affemble their Forces at Briançon. This Army of his Royal Highnets will confut of the greateft part of the Infantry of Savoy, and all the Imperial and Pruffian Troops that are arriv'd at St. Baleline and Montanaro. The Re whick of Genoa has advanc'd Ten thoufand 1 ukoles to the Imperial Commiffaries, upon account of the Contributions that the Emperor demands fron that State, which will this Year amount to Thirty thoufand Pittoles, although for the precedent Year they paid but Twenty thoufand. Two Miniffers from the Duke of Modena and the Duke of Parma are arrived here, to Treat with the Imperial Commiffaries, concerning the Contributions to be paid by their Mafters; but General Zumjungen remaining ftill in Tufcany, thofe Affairs are not as yet hkely to come to any conclusion, The Count de Coningfeck, Lieutenant-General of the Imperial Froops, and one of the Adminiftrators of the Dutchy of Mantua, has received the Emperor's Orders to go from hence to Barcelona. On the Twenty fecond of this Month the Body of the Cardinal Archinto, Archbistop of this City, was interr'd in the Cathedral Church with great Soleminity and Magnificence.

Harburg, May 13. N. S. The Mufcovite Generals have alfembled their Troops that were Quarter'd in the Territories of the City of Dantzick, in order to their being review'd by Prince Menzikoff, and their departure from hence to the Campaign in Pomerania. It is thought that the King of Denmark wildefer his Journey to Copenhagen, feeing there ftil remains fome danger of the Contagion in that Place. The Infantry of the Allies of the North in Pomerania, being too far diflant from one another, and liable to be furpriz'd by the numerous Garrifon of Stralfund, have remov'd from the feveral Places in which they were Canton'd, and encamp'd on the Third of this Month, between Tribles, Anclam and Greiffswald. Monfieur Bafwitz, a Suedifh Colonel, with his Party fome Days fince attack'd a Party of Danes, who were guarding feveral Waggons laden with Accoutrements and Provisions for the Garrifon of Roltock, the Danish Commander, nam'd Rofenohr, was kill'd upon the fpot, but the reft, with the Waggons, got lafe under the Cannon of the Place. The Danish Vice-"dmiral Barfus has, ever fince the Twenty firsth of

the last Month, been Cruizing in the Baltick Sea with Ten Men of War and Four Frigats. Several Regiments of Saxony being newly come from that Country, are arrived in Pomerania.

Tournay, May 20. N. S. The British Troops began their March yesterday Morning from their Camp at Bassieux, and this Day passed the Scarpe at Lalain, and having join'd the other Confederate Troops, according to the Measures before concerted by the Generals, the two Armies were form'd, and encamp'd in the following manner: That of Prince. Eugene of Savoy from the Right at Gulezin, to the Left at Effcaillon; and that of his Grace the Duke of Ormond, with the Right at Escaillon, and . the Left at the Old Lines formerly made by the French, between Denain and Walers. The two Generals will leave this Place to Morrow Morning, and put themselves at the Head of the Armies. The British, Danish, Saxon, Prussian and Hanoverian Troops, with some belonging to the States General, or in their particular Pay, will compose that commanded by the Duke of Orntond, amounting to near Seventy Battalions, and an Hundred and forty Squadrons; and the Imperial Troops, with the re-maining Forces, will compose that of Prince Eu-gene. Two Regiments of Imperial Dragbons, confifting of Six Squadrons each, and Five Battalions of Foot being arrived here Yefterday, will proceed to. the Gamp to Morrow. As foon as the last of the Imperior Troops have join'd the Army, which, ac-cording to their Route, will be on the Twenty third Instant, it is thought that we shall pais the Schelde, and take the Camp of Averne le Sezq; where the Army encampt last Year, during the Siege of Bouchain. We have Intelligence, that two Days ago, the Enemy receiv'd a Reinforcement of Twenty two Battalions, and Fifteen Squadrons, from the Rhine.

Hague, May 20. N. S. On the Sixteenth Inftant, three of the Plenipotentiaries of the States-General return'd to Utrecht, after having had feveral Meetings with the Deputies of the States, and the Grand Penfionary. Monfieur Buys, who was the fourth who came hither, did not go back till the next Day, being hinder'd by the Journey he had taken to Amfterdam, to know the Sentiments of that City, in relation to a General Feace. The Count de Sinzendorff and Monfieur de Consbruck were Yefterday in Conference with the Deputies of the States, and return'd that day to Utrecht; as did likewile the Baron Bothmar, who will fpeedily fee forwards to the Court of Hanover. Don Lewis Da Cunha went Yefterday to the General Congrefs, and will be follow'd to Morrow by the Count farouca, who ftaid here to difpatch an Express for Portugal, by the way of England. We are inform'd by feveral Letters from Conftantipople, that the Peace was concluded between 'the Turks and Mufcovites, and that the Articles agreed upon betwixt them, would be exchang'd in two Days.

Count Sinzendorff is come back from the Hague, with those other Ministers who went thither ; and this Morning, Baron Bothmar, Plenipo-tentiary from his Highness the Elector of Hanover and Brunswick, upon his return, made a Visit to both the Plenipotentiaries of the Queen of Great Britain, and to Mr. Harley, Her Majesty's Minifter to the Court of Hanover; the latter intends very shortly to repair thither, as does likewife the Baron Bothmar, who is expected back to continue here, and affift at the Conferences to be held for a General Leace.
