Florence, May 10. N. S.

\*E are advised from the German Camp be-fore Monte Philippo, that on the third Instant that Fort was deliver'd up to them, and the Garrifon made Prifoners of War. The Governor of Porto Ercole foon after beat a Parley, and upon Condition that the Garrifon, at their own Charges, fhould be Transported to Marseilles, they furrendred the Place to General Zumjungen. It was thought that after the Germans had made themfelves Mafters of those two Places, they would have formed the Siege of Porto Longone, but the Emperor has fent them Orders to return into the Milanefe, and they are now actually on their March towards Milan, where, according to the Route pro-pos'd, the way to be Twentieth of this Γhe rm'd at the great Month. Preparations of the Tu ks, and have therefore fent their feveral Minifters to follicit for Succours from all the Neighbouring States, and one of them is come to the Court of the Great Duke upon that Occafion.

Venice, May 13. N. S. We have Advice from Rome, that the Pope had order'd that all the Neapolitan Veffels in his Ports should be Seiz'd, becaufe the Neapolitans had ftop'd two of his Gallies, which, as they thought were carrying Powder to Porto Ercole: But upon a Remonstrance made, that it was usual for Befiegers to feize upon any Provifions or Ammunition, which they suspected to be de-fign'd to be carried into any I own, before which they lay, the aforefaid Orders were countermand-ed. This Republick is at prefent under no Apprehenfions of a Rupture with the Ottoman Port, fince the Receipt of their last Letters from the Signior Mocenigo, their Bailo at Conftantinople. Upon Sun-day last, the Doge perform'd the Yearly Ceremony, which is call'd the Marriage of the Republick with the Adriatick Sea, by throwing a Ring into it, with a great Attendance and Splendor: The Ceremony was deferred till this time, because of the tempeituous Weather on that Day, on which it properly fhould have been performed. The Earl of Peterborough is in Health, and continues still in this City.

Vienna, May 11. N. S. His Imperial Majefty, fome Days ago went to Laxembourg, to take the diversion of Hunting. The Count Marazzani Vifconti, Gentleman of the Bedchamber to the Duke of Parma, and his Envoy Extraordinary to this Court, has been admitted to an Audience of the Emperor, to congratulate him upon his Acceffion to tl e Imperial Dignity. The Emperor has likewife given Audience to the Baron d'Urbick, who has deliver'd fresh Credentials from his Master the Czar of Muscoyy. The Journey of this Court to Presbourg, is deferred till the Seventeenth of this N onth, by reason of the great Floods occasion'd by the overflowing of the Danube near this City.

Coire, May 4. N. S. The Two Cantons of Zurich and Bern have lately made a review of their Troops, and found that their Army amounted to above Threefcore thousand Men, of which Number two thirds belong to the Cat on of Bern, which is capable of fehding Twenty housand more in cale of neceffity. The Catholici Cantons have not half that number of Forces at p elent, and are very ill provided with fuch things as are convenient for them.

Bafil, May 12. N. S. The Cantons of Zurich and Bern, and the Five Roman Catholick Cantons who have taken the Part of the Abbot of St. Gall, perfift fill in each of their Pretensions. The Roman Catholick Cantons which were come to Baden, are return'd thence; as are likewife the Neutral Cantons; but before their Departure, they refolved upon the Eighteenth of this Month to renew their Conferences, in cafe they and the Protestant Cantons could agree to a Suspension of Arms, and have a free Meeting at Baden; and that, if it should be thought more proper, they would affemble at Soleure or Arbourg, to determine the Differences that are now in Queftion.

Hamburg, May 20. N. S. We have Advice from ienna, that the Emperor has conflituted the Vienna, that the Emperor has constituted the Count Nicolas d'Illieshazza, to be Chancellor of Hungary; and that the Prince and Cardinal of Saxe Zeits, the Primate of that Country, has made all neceffary Preparations to receive and Crown his Imperial Majefty, as their King, at Presbourg, for which Place the Emperor will let forward upon the Seventeenth or Eighteenth of this Instant. His Majeity has fent feveral Engineers to vifit all the Fortifications upon the Frontiers of that Kingdom, and to order fuch Repairs and new Works to be made, We have likewife an as they shall think fitting. Account by the last Letters from Vienna, that the Peace was confirmed between the Ottoman Port and the Muscovites: They farther add, that the King of Sueden was to be conducted by a fufficient Guard through Poland, to the Frontiers of Pome-rania. The Muscovite General, Monfieur Bruce, who lies at prefent before Dantzick, has Letters from Petersbourg, that the Baron de Schapiroff has fent an Account from Conftantinople to the Czar his Mafter, that all the Articles of Peace between his Czarish Majesty and the Port were regulated, and that it was left to the King of Sueden to chafe the Route he would take in the Paifage to his ewn Dominions. It is reported here, that the Czar has fent Orders for a Bedy of his Troops, confifting of Fifteen or Sixteen thousand Men to March by tho way of Ingermerland in Finland, to attack the Fortrefs of Abo.

Whitebaven, May 14. On the Twelfth Inflant, a fmall Veffel was brought in here, which had been taken up at Sea, near the Isle of Man, by the Speedwell's Prize, with only two Women and a Child on Board; who reported, that a French Privateer of two two Guns, had just before taken and plunder'd her, carried off the Men, and abandon'd the Vessel and

them to the Mercy of the Sea. *Tarmouth, May* 19. Yefterday país'd through our Road a Fleet of Laden Colliers from Newcaftley to the Southward. The fame Day feveral Light Colliers and Coafters fail'd' to the Northward, under Convoy of feveral of Her Majefty's Ships.
