Venice, May 15. N. S. This Republick is preparing a fresh Convoy of Provisions, Ammunitions and Troops for the Levant; and the Regiment of Roffi, confifting of a Thousand Foot, which lately arrived in the Lido from the Terra Firma, will be fent thither We have Letters from Malta importing, that the Gallies of that State were fitted out to Cruize after the Corfairs of Barbary, that disturb the Navigation in the Levant and Mediterranean; and that the Algerines demanded Twenty five thouland Crowns for the Redemption of Signior Signorini, a Gentleman of the Emperor's Bedchamber, whom they had taken as he was going to Lisbon, to carry the News of the Coronation of his Imperial Majefty.

From the Camp before Solemmes, May 28. N. S. On Thurfday the Twenty fixth Instant the two Armies, commanded by his Grace the Duke of Ormond and Prince Eugene, march'd from their Camp between Doway and Marchiennes, having paffed the Schelde between Bouchain and Dinain. That of the Prince is encamped with the Rightmat Neuveville upon the Schelde, and the Left at Montrecourt, from whence that of his Grace extends to the Left at Veilli, with the River Sette behind them. The Body of Troops commanded by General Fagel at Lieu St. Amand, joined the Armies upon their coming to this Camp, and took their Poils in the Lines. This Morning a Detachment of Four thoufand Horse of the two Armies, under the Command of Count Felts, and all the Grenadiers of the Duke of Ormond's Army, commanded by General Withers, advanced to the Source of the Schelde, to view the Situation of the Enemy, who are encamp'd with their Right at Catelett, and their Left near Cambray, with the Schelde before them. This Evening the Detachment returned to the Camp, having met with no Disturbance from the Enemy

From on Board the Monk in Kinsale Harbour May 9. Capt. Camock, Commander of Her Majefty's Ship the Monk, having Intelligence that feveral of the Enemies Privateers were Cruizing off the Cape, fet fail of the Twenty eighth of the last Month, and the fame Day took a 1 tivateer called the Salamander, of Sixteen Guns, and One hundred and fifty Men, belonging to Havre de Grace. On the Twenty ninth the Captain retook a Ship called the Boyle Galley, of about Two hundred and fifty Tuns, and of the Value of Eight thousand Pounds, belonging to Cork. After this the Captain met with the Oxford Galley from Barbadoes, and two other Gallies which he faw fafe into Crookhaven, where he landed ten Guns, made two Batteries on each fide the Harbour, raifed the Militia, and intrench'd each fide, fo that it was impossible for them to be attack'd, and then fet fail in pursuit of the Enemy. In the Captain's Absence, one of the Privateers, of forty Guns, fent his Boat to the Har-bour with a Flag for the Veffels there to Surreguer or Ranfom, but they firing both from on Board and from the Batteries on Shore, he foon left them. The next Day the Captain got fight of the fame Privateer, and after two Hours Engagement took her; fhe is called the Count Giraldin of St. Maloes, of Forty Guns and Three hundred and fifty five Men, Commanded by Captain du Pre: The Enemy had Thirty Men killed and Ten wounded, without the loss of one Person belonging to Her Majesty. The lofs of one Perfon belonging to Her Majefty. Ships retaken and laved amount to upwards the Value of Fifty thousand Pounds.
