By the Act for laying Duties upon Soap,

T is EnaGed, That for Soap Stock in hand, viz. for all Soap for Sale, as well Foreign as of Britifh Manu-tacture, which any Soap-Boiler, Chandler, or other Seller or Dealersin Soap, fhall be poffetted of or intere-fted in on the 10th of June next, there mult be paid the fol-lowing Duries, viz. Two Pence per pound for Foreign Soap, and One Penny per pound for Britifh Soap. And all Soap-Boilers, Chandlers, and all other Sellers or Dealers in Soap, and other Perfons who on the faid 10th of June fhall have any Soap belonging to fuch Soap-Boilers, Chandlers, or other Sellers or Dealers in Soap, mult on or before the faid 10th of June, at the refpective Offices for the faid Duries on Soap next to their refpective Habira-

the faid Duties on Soap next to their respective Habitations, make true and particular Entries of the full Quantities for sore in the similar particular entries of the fun Quantities of Soap, as well Foreign as Britifh, for Sale, which they re-fpectively fhall have on the faid toth of June, on pain to forfeit 501. and the Soap for which fuch Entry is neglected. And in fix Days after fuch Entry fhall be or fhould be

made, mult pays or give Security to pay the faid Duties. Upon prompt Payment, viz, within the faid fix Days, there is to be a diffcount of 101. per Cent for Stock in hand. Neglecting to pay or give Security within the faid lix Days, is a forferture of double the faid Duties.

Neglecting to pay or give Security within the faid in Days, is a forferture of double the faid Duties. Officers are to be permitted to enter all Houfes and Places belonging to Soap-Boilers, Chandlers, and other Sellers and Dealers in Soap, and to take true and particular Accounts of all Soap which fuch Soap-Boilers, Chandlers, or other Sellers or Dealers in Soap, or others in Truft for them, fhall have on the faid toth of June; and perfons refufing to let the Ot-ficers fo to enter, or to take fuch Accounts, forteit 20 l. Any perfon having on the faid 10th of June any Soap chargeable by the faid Act, who clandeflinely removes or hides any fuch Soap, or any part thereof, or fuffers the fame to be removed or hid before the faid Duties are paid or fecured, thereby forfeits 20 l. and the Soap, which may be

fecured, thereby forfeits 201. and the Soap, which may be feized to the Ufe of Her Majefty.

And any perfon in whole Cultody fuch Soap is found for-

feits 5 s, for every fuch Pound of Soap fo hid, &c. The like Dutics must be paid for all Soap, as well Foreign as British, which shall be Imported or made after the faid

as Britifh, which fhall be imported or made after the faid ioth of June, 1712. And if any Makers of Soap for Sale or not for Sale, do not on or before the faid toth of June give Notice in Wri-ting at the next Office for the faid Duties on Soap, of their Names, and of all Boiling-houfes, Work-houfes, Store-houfes, Ware-houfes, Sho<sub>1</sub>%, Rooms, and other Places ufed for making or keeping of Soap, or ior boiling or keeping Oil, Tallow, Potafh, Lime, or other Materials for making Soap; an l of all their Coppers, Kettles, Furnices, Fats, Cifferns, Troughs, or other Veffels ufed in the Boiling or Making of Soap; or if they afterwards ufe or alter any Boiling-houfes, &c or any Copper, &c. for any the faid purpoles, without firlt giving fuch Notice, they forfeit 501. for every Offence. If they charge any Copper, Pan, or other Utenfil with Materials for making Soap, or fill out Soap between the Hours of Ten at Ni<sub>2</sub>nt and Five in the Morning (without Notice to the proper Officer) they forcit 201. for every

Notice to the proper Officer) they for leit 20 l. for every Offence.

and how much of it was made at each Boiling, on pain to forfeit for every neglect sol.

Soap-makers within the faid Bills of Mortality every four Soap-makers within the faid Bills of Mortality every tour Weeks, and Soap-makers in other Places every fix Weeks, atter fuch Entry fhall be or fhould have been made, mult pay and clear off their remetive Duties for fuch Soap, on the Penalty to pay double Dury. And if atter fuch Derait they fell, deliver, or carry oug any fuch Soap before luch Duty paid, they forfeit double the Value of fuch Soap for fold, delivered, or carried out. They muft permit the Officers for the faid Duties by Day or by Night (and if by Night in the Prefence of a Con-flable or other Officer of the Pcace) to enter their Houfes and all Places whatfoever belonging to or ufed by them.

Itable or other Officer of the Peace) to enter their Houlds and all Places whatfoever belonging to or ufed by them, and by gauging or weighing their Soap, or otherwife to take Accounts of the juil Quantities of their Soap, of which the Officer is to make a Report, which is to be a Charge upon the Maker, who upon demand muft have a Copy thereof; and if the Officer refufes fuch Copy, he forteits 40 s.

If Soap-makers don'r keep fufficient Scales and Weights, ondon't permit and alfult the Officers in uling them for weigh-

ordon't permit and affift the Officers in ufing them for weigh-ing rheir Soap, they forfeit rol. The Officers are to be permitted by gauging or weigh-ing to take Account of all Materials for making Soap, and after upon miffing fuch Materials may charge the Maker with as much Soap as fuch Materials, in the Officers Judg-ment, would have made, not exceeding fourteen Gallons of Ingredients for every Barrel, and 6 proportionably. Soap-maker who obtirues or hin lers any Officer in en-tring his Houfe, &c. or in tak ng fuch Accounts, or in the Execution of any of the Powers given by the faid Act, forfeits for every Offence 201. Removing, carrying or finding away Soap before Ac-

forfeits for every Offence 201. Removing, carrying or finding away Soap before Ac-count taken by the Officer, unlefs on twenty for r Hours Notice within the Bills of Mostal y, and two D ys Notice in other Places, is a forfeiture of 201. for every Offence. If during the refred ve Times before mentioned Soap not Surveyed be not kept fepara e from Soap which has been Surveyed, it is a forfeiture of 51. for every Offence. Fraudulently hiding or conceal ng, or caufing to be hid or concealed, any Soap chargeable by the faid A&, or any Materials for making Soap, 15 a forfeiture of 201. for every Offence.

All Soap, Oil, Tallow, and Matarials for making Soap, found in any private Boiling-houfe, Work-houfe, Ware-houfe and other Place, and all private Coppers, Kettles, Furnaces, Troughs and other Velles, of which no Entry thall be made, or Notice given as atorefaid, are forfeited, and they or the Value thereof may be feized for the Ufe of Her Majeffty.

Her Majerty's Committioners for the faid Duties upon Soap, having duly appointed Offices for the faid Duties upon Soap to be kept at the leveral Hours and Places where Offices of Excite are now kept, all Perfons concerned are there to make fuch Entries as are required by the foregoing A&.
