The exceptions referred to will enable a vehicle to wait for so long as is necessary—(a) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle, (b) to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any wedding or funeral, any building, industrial or demolition operation, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein, (c) to enable the vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes, (d) to enable the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said side of length of road, and (e) to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle
