*Genoa, May 22. N. S.*

**H**ER Majesty's Fleet, under the Command of Sir John Jennings, sailed from Vado to Leghorn upon the Sixteenth Instant, at which time he sent hither the Dartmouth and Winchelsea to Convey the Transport Ships to this Port; soon after which, the two Ships before mentioned, sailed for Leghorn to join the Admiral, who arrived there upon the Eighteenth to take in Provisions; which being done, he designs to return back to Vado. On Wednesday arrived here the Crown Brigantine, in Eight Days from Barcelona, the Captain in his way, although he had only Fourteen Men and Boys, took a French Vessel off Toulon, which came from Martinico with Sugars, but had unladen part of them, and several thousand Dollars at Malaga. The St. George Privateer likewise, on this side of Leghorn, taken a French Ship laden with Corn and some Silk, and did another, shor on the Coast of Massa di Carrara, both which were bound for Marseilles.

*Berlin, June 14. N. S.* Upon Wednesday last Prince Menzikoff went by Frankfort upon the Oder, in his way to meet with King Augustus at Dresden, from whence he will return in eight Days for Pomerania. Monsieur le Chotell, who was lately the King of Prussia's Resident at Weimar, is likewise gone to Saxony with a new Commission. On Thursday last Two thousand Saxon Horse passed through Copenick, which is two Miles distant from this Place, in their March from Saxony to Pomerania, to Recruit the Troops of King Augustus in that Country, from whence there is Advice, that the Muscovites have been lately Reinforced by four thousand Men, under the Command of General Galliczin. Brigadier Breton, an Envoy from the Queen of Great Britain to this Court, being lately arriv'd here, went this Afternoon to take a private Audience of the King at Charlottenburg.

*From the Camp of the Allies before Quefnoy, June 16. N. S.* The Deserters which come daily from Quefnoy, inform us, that the Garrison of the Place had above an hundred Men kill'd and wounded in the last Sally which they made upon us out of the Town. Upon the fourteenth and fifteenth of this Instant, as likewise this Day, our Engineers view'd the Ground as near to the Place as it was possible, and our Line of Circumvallation being perfected, it is expected that the Trenches will soon be opened; but the time is not determined. Yesterday about Thirty Ladies of Quality, with their Families and Effects, went out of the Place by permission from General Fagel, and were conducted to Landreies, and several of their Country Houses in the Neighbourhood. We hear from the Camp of the Allies at Hatpre, that Prince Eugene, together with the Deputies of the States General, has been to take a view of the Forces under the Command of the Earl of Albemarle at Denain. The Army under his Grace the Duke of Ormond, continues in the same situation as formerly.

*Brussels, June 20. N. S.* We hourly expect some advice from the Detachments sent from the Army of

Prince Eugene, under the Command of Major General Grovenstein on the Ninth Instant, to raise Contributions in the French Territories. The latest Account is that of the Sixteenth from Rheims, the Capital of the Province of Champaign, which say, that those Forces had passed that Place with divers Hostages, and that they had burnt the Villages of Marle and Cressy, and several other Places which had refused to pay Contributions; and that their Hussars had advanced within Ten Leagues of Paris. Twenty four Hours after their March, Marshal Villars sent four thousand Horse, in hopes to overtake them: However, it is the Opinion here, that they may secure their Retreat, by Huy or by Traerbach, or some other part of Germany. Sir James Wishart is expected here the latter end of the next Week, in his return from the Spaw. Here are Letters of the Twenty seventh past from Barcelona, which bring an Account that the Court there were apprehensive that the Enemy would make some Efforts towards the Siege of Terragona, because they had assembled their Army, and were making Preparations for some Enterprize.

*Hague, June 19. N. S.* The Baron de Heemis, Envoy from the Emperor, has notified the Coronation of his Imperial Majesty, as King of Hungary, at Presbourg, to the States General, and presented them a Letter from his Majesty upon the same Subject; whereupon they have returned an Answer in Writing, to congratulate his Majesty upon his Accession to that Dignity. Monsieur de Maracoff, Ambassador from the Czar of Muscovy, has likewise notified to the States General, by the Order of the Czar his Master, that the Peace between his Czarish Majesty and the Ottoman Port, was renewed and ratified on both sides; and Yesterday Monsieur Cleversherk, President of the Assembly of the States for this Week, went personally to the House of the Ambassador to make his Compliments of Congratulation thereupon, in the Name of the States General. The States of Holland and Westfriesland adjourned themselves Yesterday till the Thursday following.

*Utrecht, June 21. N. S.* Upon the eighteenth Instant, the Plenipotentiaries of the States General had a Conference with several other Ministers, at the House of Messieurs Buys and Vander Duffen, Plenipotentiaries for Holland; and on Sunday the Nineteenth, the Plenipotentiaries of the States General met at the Lord Privy Seal's Houle, and were some time in Conference with his Lordship. Yesterday, most of the Ministers of the Allies met as usual in the Town-house, and in the Afternoon the Marquis del Borgo, one of the Plenipotentiaries from his Royal Highness the Duke of Savoy, returned from the Hague, where he has been for some Days past. In the Evening, the French Plenipotentiaries dispatched a Courier to their Court; from whence they have advice, that according to the Accounts from Spain, the Dutchess of Anjou was deliver'd of a Son between the Seventh and Eighth Instant.

*Bristol, June 21.* Yesterday sailed out of King-road Her Majesty's Ship the Poole, and under her Convey ten sail of Irish Traders, bound for Cork and Waterford.
