

ISLE OF WIGHT COUNTY COUNCIL

The County Council of Isle of Wight (Various Streets, Ventnor/St Lawrence/Bonchurch, IW) (Traffic Regulation) Order No 1 1985

Notice is hereby given that the County Council of Isle of Wight in exercise of their powers under sections 1, 2 and 4 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and of all other powers them enabling in that behalf and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police have made an Order the effect of which is as follows

- (1) To revoke "The County Council of Isle of Wight (Various Streets, Ventnor/St Lawrence/Bonchurch, IW) (Traffic Regulation) Order No 1 1984"
- (2) To re-enact the provisions contained in the above Order subject to the following amendments

- (i) To prohibit the waiting of vehicles at any time in the following lengths of road

Bonchurch Village Road, on south side, from 45 feet east to 450 feet east of Shore Road

Bonchurch Village Road, on north side, from 150 feet west to 50 feet east of Shore Road

Bonchurch Village Road, on north side, from 200 feet east to 250 feet east of Shore Road

Down Lane, on south-east side, from 45 feet north-east of Newport Road to the south-western junction with Downsidge

East Street, on east side, from Clarence Road to 25 feet north thereof

South Street, on both sides, from Clarence Road to 25 feet west thereof

A3055 Undercliff Drive, on both sides, from 100 feet west to 100 feet east of Woolverton Road

South Street, on north side, from West Street to 15 feet east thereof

- (ii) To prohibit the waiting of vehicles at any time, 1st May to 30th September, in the following lengths of road

Bellevue Road, on north-west side, from the southern junction with Zig Zag Road to 75 feet north-east thereof

Dudley Road, on south side, from Buona Vista Road to 65 feet west thereof

- (iii) To limit the waiting of vehicles to 1 hour in any 2 hours, 8 a.m. to 6 p.m., 1st May to 30th September, in the following length of road

Bonchurch Village Road, on north side, from 50 feet east to 200 feet east of Shore Road

- (iv) To limit the waiting of vehicles to 1 hour in any 2 hours, 8 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday to Saturday, in the following length of road

Spring Hill, on south-east side, from 50 feet north to 140 feet north of High Street.

The Order is designed to reduce congestion and delay in the said roads and to facilitate the free flow of traffic generally in the promotion of road safety. The Order contains exemption clauses to permit the loading and unloading of goods and will come into operation on Friday, 21st June 1985

Any person who desires to question the validity of the said Order on the grounds that it is not within the powers of section 1 of the said Act as amended or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or any Instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to this Order may, within 6 weeks of the date hereof, apply to the High Court for the purpose

KENT COUNTY COUNCIL

The Kent County Council (Dartford Tunnel and Approaches) (50 m.p.h. Speed Limit) Order 1985

Notice is hereby given that on 27th June 1985 the Kent County Council with the consent of the Secretary of State for Transport made an Order under section 84 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 which will impose a 50 m.p.h. speed limit on the Dartford Tunnel and Approach Roads (A282) as follows

(a) The northbound tunnel and approach road from 260 metres south of the portal to the Kent/Essex boundary (approximately 1100 metres), and

(b) the southbound tunnel and approach road from the Kent/Essex boundary to 1030 metres south of the portal (approximately 1880 metres)

Essex County Council has gained the Secretary of State's consent to the making of a similar Order imposing a 50 m.p.h. speed limit on the tunnels and certain lengths of the approach road situated in that County

A copy of the Order which comes into operation on 1st July 1985 and a map showing the lengths of road concerned may be inspected during normal office hours at Room 197, County Hall, Maidstone

The Kent County Council (Various Roads New Romney) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1985

Notice is hereby given that the Kent County Council proposes to make an Order under sections 1, and 124 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1948, the effect of which would be to prohibit the waiting of vehicles between 8.30 a.m. and 8 p.m. daily at New Romney as follows

(a) *Langport Road*, from Littlestone Road/Station Road for 40 metres northwards,

(b) *Littlestone Road/Station Road* south side, between points 30 metres east and 21 metres west of Mountfield Road, and

(c) *Mountfield Road*, from Littlestone Road/Station Road southwards on the east side for 275 metres and on the west side for 36 metres

Exceptions would be provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait with police permission or for passengers to board or alight, for the loading or unloading of goods, for enabling work to be carried out in or adjacent to the road, for disabled persons and for emergency service vehicles

A copy of the proposed Order, an explanatory statement and a map showing the length of road concerned may be inspected during normal office hours at Room 197, County Hall, Maidstone, or at the offices of the Shepway District Council, District Offices, Council Offices, Rolfe Lane, New Romney

The Kent County Council (Sea Wall Dymchurch) (Prohibition of Right-Hand Turns) Order 1985

Notice is hereby given that on 27th June 1985, the Kent County Council made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 the effect of which is to prohibit the driving of vehicles so as to make a right-hand turn from Sea Wall into High Street, Dymchurch

If you wish to question the validity of the Order, or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any Instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made, apply to the High Court for this purpose
