At the request of the Secretary of State for Energy, and as agreed by the Pipelines Inspectorate, Marathon Oil UK Ltd presents the following information about the 18 OD inch Condensate and Gas pipelines from Brae "A" to Brae "B"

Pre-commissioning testing

The pipeline will be tested to the satisfaction of the Pipelines Inspectorate prior to commissioning

Design pressure

The maximum pressure in the line will be less than the pressure for which the pipeline has been designed

Leak detection

Pressure and flow will be monitored at all times

In the event of a leak being detected the pipeline pressure will be reduced to control the leak. An aerial and underwater survey will be conducted to find the source of the leak

Routine surveillance will be carried out along the pipeline route

Emergency action

In the event a major break occurs in the pipeline the following emergency action will be taken

- (1) All product delivery into the pipeline will be manually or automatically stopped
- (2) Department of Energy Pipelines Inspectorate will be notified immediately
- (3) An underwater survey and aerial survey will be carried out to determine the location of the break
- (4) Should pollution result from the discharge of the product the emergency pollution control system held in constant readiness by the UK Offshore Operators Association will be mobilised

Recommissioning
