

Waiting by vehicles of the under-mentioned classes or for the under-mentioned purposes are exempted from the provisions of the Order:

- (a) to enable persons to board or alight;
- (b) to enable goods to be loaded and unloaded;
- (c) delivering and collecting mail by Post Office vehicles;
- (d) for the collection or delivery of furniture or effects with police consent;
- (e) for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;
- (f) any building or demolition operation, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the side of length of road and the supply of gas, electricity and water and maintenance of any telecommunications apparatus.

An exemption in the Order also permits the waiting by disabled persons' vehicles displaying a badge issued under the Local Authority's Orange Badge Scheme for a limited period of two hours, return prohibited within a further period of one hour.

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

The County of Hereford and Worcester (Kingsley Avenue, Farm Road and Arthur Street, Redditch) (Prohibition of Heavy Commercial Vehicles over 7.5 tonnes) Order 1985

Notice is hereby given that Hereford and Worcester County Council propose to make an Order under section 1(1) and (2), 2(4) and 3(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and of all other enabling powers, the effect of which will be that no person shall cause or permit any vehicle the gross weight of which exceeds 7.5 tonnes to proceed in the roads and length of road in the Borough of Redditch in the County of Hereford and Worcester specified in the Schedule to this Notice.

Exemptions are contained in the Order for vehicles of the following classes or for the following purposes if the vehicle:

- (a) is being used for or in connection with the conveyance of persons, goods, merchandise, furniture or effects;
- (b) is being used in any building or demolition operation, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the roads and the supply of gas, electricity and water and maintenance of any telecommunications apparatus;
- (c) is being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;
- (d) is being used for the purpose of agriculture in connection with land adjacent to the lengths of road or in the conveyance of timber felled upon that land;
- (e) is being used to gain access for the services of a garage;
- (f) is being used in connection with a circus, fair or similar event which has been authorised by the Council;
- (g) is being used for or in connection with the conveyance of goods for sale from that vehicle;
- (h) is being used to gain access to any land or premises where there is no other form of access;
- (i) is a mechanical road cleansing vehicle.

That length of the Penwortham By-Pass from a point 75 metres north east of the north-eastern edge of the Cop Lane Bridge up to and including the Broad Oak Lane roundabout and that length of the western Primary from the southern edge of the carriageway of Broad Oak Lane roundabout to the south side of the Pope Lane roundabout, for a total distance of approximately 1,226 metres southwards.

The Lancashire County Council Penwortham By-Pass (Cop Lane to Broad Oak Lane) (South Ribble Borough) (Clearway) Order 1985
