The County Council of Isle of Wight New Yar Bridge Scheme 1985

Notice is hereby given that the County Council of Isle of Wight, pursuant to its powers under section 106 of the Highways Act 1980, have on 29th November 1985, made the County Council of Isle of Wight New Yar Bridge Scheme 1985 and are about to submit the Scheme to the Secretary of State for the Department of Transport for confirmation. The effect of the said scheme is to allow the Council to construct a bridge from a point on the east bank of the River Yar to a point on the west bank of the River Yar approximately 24 metres south of the centre line of the existing bridge. The bridge will be 9.3 metres wide overall and will carry a carriageway with a minimum width of 5.5 metres and two 1.5 metre wide footways. The bridge will have an overall length of 103 metres.

A copy of the Scheme as submitted to the Secretary of State for the Department of Transport may be inspected between the hours of 9.30 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. Monday to Friday at County Hall, Newport, Isle of Wight.
