

## CUMBRIA COUNTY COUNCIL

*The County of Cumbria (Keswick, Main Street, Market Place/Square) (Prohibition of Driving) Order 1986*

Notice is hereby given that Cumbria County Council propose to make an Order under sections 1 (1) and (2), 2 (1) to (3) and 3 (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

When this Order comes into effect you will not be allowed to cause or permit any vehicle to proceed in that length of Main Street, which extends from the junction of Market Place, and the south-east highway boundary of Police Station Court to, on the south-west side, its junction with Lake Road, and on the south-east side its junction with St. John's Street and in St. John's Street from its junction with Main Street to its junction with Station Street on Saturdays between the hours of 8.30 a.m. and 5.30 p.m.

Exemptions in the Order will permit invalid carriages to proceed in the above lengths of road, goods to be loaded or unloaded, and access on to and off non-highway land namely courts, forecourts yards.

A copy of the draft Order together with a plan showing the lengths of road concerned and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order may be inspected at the offices of the Allerdale District Council, 50 Main Street, Keswick, and at the offices of the undersigned during normal office hours.

*The Derbyshire County Council (Stanley Street, Somercotes) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1986*

Notice is hereby given that the Derbyshire County Council propose to make an Order, under sections 1, (1) and (2), 2 (1) to (3) and 4 (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and of all other enabling powers.

When this Order comes into effect you will not be allowed to leave your vehicle in the following lengths of road at Somercotes:

*No Waiting Monday to Saturday, 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.*

*Stanley Street, both sides throughout its length.*

*Thurston Avenue*

North-west side, from its junction with Stanley Street to its junction with Haston Drive.

South-east side, from its junction with Stanley Street for a distance of approximately 50 metres.

*Somercotes Hill, north-east side, from a point approximately 15 metres north-west of the centre line of Stanley Street in a south-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 30 metres.*

Exemptions will be provided in the Order to enable vehicles to wait for so long as may be necessary for a

person to board or alight from the vehicle; to enable goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle; to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic; the maintenance of the roads or the services therein to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated within the lengths of road; or as part of a funeral or wedding cortege. The usual exemptions for disabled persons' vehicles will be provided in the Order.

Full details of the proposals are in the draft Order which, together with a map showing the prohibited areas and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order may be examined at Room 108, County Offices, Matlock (Mrs. J. Senior), during normal office hours 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday to Friday, and at the offices of Amber Valley District Council, Cornhill House, Nottingham Road, Alfreton.

## DERBYSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

*The Derbyshire County Council (Egginton Village) (Weight Restriction) Order 1986*

Notice is hereby given that the Derbyshire County Council propose to make an Order under sections 1 (1), (2), 2 (4) and 3 (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and of all other enabling powers.

The effect of this Order will be to prohibit any person from causing or permitting any goods vehicle the maximum permissible gross weight of which exceeds 7.5 tonnes to proceed in the lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this notice.

Exemptions will be provided in the Order for:

- (a) The purpose of access to premises on or adjacent to the lengths of road;
- (b) The purpose of agriculture in connection with land adjacent to the lengths of road;
- (c) In connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or re-construction, the laying, erection, alteration or repair of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of a telegraphic line, as defined in the Telegraph Act 1878 in or adjacent to the lengths of road;
- (d) For fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes.
- (e) In the course of military training operations.
- (f) The passage of winter maintenance vehicles.
