Hanover, August 16. N. S. Three Companies of the Foot guards are march'd to Reinforce the Troops of his Electoral Highness, on the Frontiers of the Dutchy of Bremen, notwithstanding that the King of Denmark has given Orders to all the Officers and Soldiers of his Army, not to do any Injury to the Elector's Subjects upon Pain of Death.
