The A46 Trunk Road (Tormarton, Avon) (Limitation of Walting) Order 1986

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3) and 4(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 on the Bath-Lincoln Trunk Road (A46) at Tormarton in the District of Northavon in the County of Avon.

The effect of the Order will be to limit waiting by vehicles to a maximum period of 2 hours in each of the lay-bys flanking either side of the trunk road (A46) south of its junction with the London-South Wales Motorway (M4 Junction 18) at Tormarton, with the proviso that no vehicle shall return to the lay-by where it has been parked within 2 hours of leaving that lay-by. The lay-bys affected area

The lay-bys affected are:

- 1. the lay-by on the eastern side of the trunk road which extends from a point opposite the entrance to Tormarton Motorway Maintenance Compound southwards for a distance of 133 metres, and
- 2. the lay-by on the western side of the trunk road which extends from a point 268 metres south of the entrance to the Motorway Maintenance Compound southwards for a distance of 113 metres.

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

The Liverpool-Leeds-Hull Trunk Road (A63) (South Docks Road, Hull) (24 Hour Main Carriageway Clearway) (Variation) Order 1986

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) and (2), 3(2) and 4(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 the effect of which will be to vary the existing South Docks Road Clearway Order by prohibiting waiting on any part of the verges of the Liverpool-Leeds-Hull Trunk Road (A63) (South Docks Road) in the County of Humberside, which extends from its junction with the A63 Ferriby Bypass (185 metres west of the Ferriby High Road junction) in the Borough of Beverley in a generally easterly direction to its junction with Hessle Road on the east side of the Daltry Street Flower. in the City of Kingston-upon-Hull, a total Daltry Street Flyover, in the City of Kingston-upon-Hull, a total distance of approximately 6.9 kilometres.
