Hamburg, Sept. 2. N. S. Yesterday Morning the Chamade was beat at Staden, and Hostilities ceased on both fides for fome hours. The Commandant demanded, That the Garrifon might be allowed to march out of the Place with all the Marks of Honour used upon such Occasions. As also, That a Pardon should be granted to the Danish Deserters in the Town, of whom it is faid there is a confiderable number. But these Conditions were rejected by the King; whereupon, at night, Hoftilities were renewed, and Preparations were making for a general Affault. The Plague encreasing every Day in Holstein, His Danith Majefty has ordered the Paffage of the two Belts to be shut, for fear the Contagion should spinad into the Island of Funen, and from thence into that of Zeland.

Hanover, Sept. 2. N. S. On the 25th of laft month his Electoral Highnels, attended by feveral Gentlemen-of the Court, went to hunt at Veyhaufennear Zell, where he pass'd a week, and returned this Day to Hercuhauten. Monfigur Fabrice, who had been Envoy to King Augustus, is appointed to go with the fame Character to the Czar in Pomerania, and intends to fet out very foon towards that Province. The last Letters from Constantinople fay, that the King of Sweden intends to continue at Benden fome time longer.

Utredit, Sept. 6. N. S. The Generals Schulen-burg and Bernar, the former of whom has been in the Service of King Augustus, and the latter in that of the Duke of Holstein-Gottorp, are lately arrived here.
