Most Gracious and Dread Sovereign,

**W**ith the most sincere Loyalty, profound Humility, and submissive Reverence, we beg leave to approach Your most Sacred Throne, humbly to acknowledge in the sincerest manner our dutiful Gratitude to Your Majesty, for the near View of a solid and lasting Peace, which (notwithstanding the artful Contrivances and envious Efforts of designing Men) Your unspeakable Wisdom, and tender Care of Your People, has brought so great a length.

It is now our Duty, in all Humility, to beseech Your Majesty, that so glorious a Work, begun by Your obliging Goodness to Your People, and continued by Your strenuous Efforts for their Welfare, may, by Your Royal and Princely Care, be brought to a speedy and happy period, that Your People, who were blessed before by Your Glorious Reign in time of War, may quickly feel the unerring Consequences of the Peace, upon the glorious and advantageous Terms, as proposed by Your Majesty.

May then Your Majesty long live and Reign to enjoy the Throne of Your Glorious Ancestors, and when the dreadful Judgment shall happen (which God of his Mercy long avert) of Your resigning the *British* Diadem, may You receive an immortal one of Glory unspeakable, from the great Rewarder: Which is the hearty sincere Prayer of, may it please Your most Sacred Majesty, Your Majesty's most Dutiful, most Obedient and Humble most Subjects and Servants.

To the QUEEN'S most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Address of the Portrieve and Free Burgesses of the ancient Borough of *St. Michael*, in the County of *Cornwall*.

**W**E Your Majesty's most Dutiful and Loyal Subjects beg leave to return our most hearty Thanks, tho' we want Words equal to the Sense we have of Your Majesty's Goodness, in communicating the Terms of Peace to Your People before You would conclude it.

We are sensible this great Condescension is what has been rarely used from the *British* Throne to their Subjects, and cannot but with Pleasure observe, it never has been, but in the Reigns of such of Your Ancestors as have been the most eminently Wise, Great and Victorious.

The War in every part of it, *Holland* and *Germany* rescued by Your Arms, *Spain* and *Italy* supported by Your Treasure, have sufficiently demonstrated Your Power; and the Plan You have laid and insisted on for Peace, and Your Conduct in the Treaty of it, have given no less Proofs both of Your Justice and Wisdom.

By it You have establish'd such a Balance of Power, as will secure to *Europe* that Liberty which Your Swords has gained for it, and Your Allies will now no more be in Danger of being over-run, and made Provinces to their too powerful Neighbour; a Benefit too great perhaps to be acknowledged by them; but we shall always with the utmost Gratitude both acknowledge and bless Your Goodness, in freeing us, not only from the Fears of the Enemy abroad, but from a Faction at home, who to carry on Designs they dared not own, were making us little less than a Province to our own Confederates.

Permit us too, to felicitate Your Majesty on those faithful and consummate Counsels which without neglecting to procure a real Security and reasonable Satisfaction to the whole Alliance, have resented to Your Imperial Crown its ancient Honour of being Arbitrer of *Europe*, and provided a Recompence to Your own People, for the unequal Burthen they have born in this expensive War, by restoring, secu-

ring and enlarging of their Trade: Nor ought our Thanks for so universal a Blessing be confin'd to Your greatest Cities and most populous Towns, since the whole Country and every Corner of it will feel the happy Effects of it.

May the same Resolution and Constancy that has hitherto so successfully carried on Your Negotiations through all the Difficulties that Envy or Self-Interest could raise to obstruct them, put a speedy as well as happy End to them; and may Your Majesty long live to enjoy all the Honours due to such great and good Actions, and that Satisfaction which good Princes take in the Happiness they procure to their People.

The following Address from the Corporation of *Tenterden*, was presented to Her Majesty by *John Brewer, Esq;* their Recorder, being introduced by the Lord High Treasurer.

To the QUEEN'S most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Address of the Mayor, Steward, Jurats and Commonalty of the ancient Town and Corporation of *Tenterden* in the County of *Kent*.

**A**fter so long and expensive a War, the near View and just Hopes of Peace, which Your Majesty hath graciously condescended to communicate to us from the Throne, hath filled with the greatest Joy and Gratitude the Hearts of all Your Subjects, except those who Profit, and therefore may delight in War.

But if it was necessary for Your Majesty's Subjects to become Principals in, and bear the greatest Burthen of this War, (though chiefly enter'd into for the more immediate rescuing Your Allies from imminent Dangers) and if that generous Undertaking hath so far succeeded, that by God's Blessing, such Terms of Peace may be obtained, by which they may be delivered from Dangers, and become secure with additional Strength: If some particular Advantages in Commerce may be procured for Our Majesty's own Subjects, certainly none ought to deny Your Majesty that Honour, or Your Subjects that Benefit which may accrue to them by a Peace, so just, so honourable, and so seasonable; in which the real Ballance of Power in *Europe*, the Protestant Interest in general, the Succession in the *Illustrious* House of *Hanover* in particular, and the Security of Trade for Great Britain, seem better consulted and taken care of than by former Treaties.

May therefore no Enemies at Home or Abroad, succeed in their dark or more open Attempts to dis-appoint Your Majesty in the Honour and Blessings of such a Peace; and that the great Author of Peace and Lover of Concord, may protect and defend Your Majesty against the Assaults and Devices of all Your Adversaries, are the constant Prayers of Your Majesty's most dutiful and faithful Subjects.

Which Addresses Her Majesty receiv'd very Graciously.

*Hamburg, Sept. 2. N. S.* Yesterday Morning the Chamade was beat at *Staden*, and Hostilities ceased on both sides for some hours. The Commandant demanded, That the Garrison might be allowed to march out of the Place with all the Marks of Honour used upon such Occasions. As also, That a Pardon should be granted to the Danish Deserters in the Town, of whom it is said there is a considerable number. But these Conditions were rejected by the King; whereupon, at night, Hostilities were renewed, and Preparations were making for a general Assault. Letters from *Pomerania*, bring an account, that the *Czar* had caused an Order to be published

lished throughout the Army, that his Subjects should no longer be called Muscovites, but Russians. The Plague encreasing every Day in Holstein, His Danish Majesty has ordered the Passage of the two Belts to be shut, for fear the Contagion should spread into the Island of Funen, and from thence into that of Zealand.

**Hanover, Sept. 2. N. S.** On the 25th of last month his Electoral Highness, attended by several Gentlemen of the Court, went to hunt at Veyhausen near Zell, where he pass'd a week, and returned this Day to Hercuhausen. Monsieur Fabrice, who had been Envoy to King Augustus, is appointed to go with the same Character to the Czar in Pomerania, and intends to set out very soon towards that Province. The last Letters from Constantinople say, that the King of Sweden intends to continue at Benden some time longer.

**Utrecht, Sept. 6. N. S.** The Generals Schulenburg and Bernar, the former of whom has been in the Service of King Augustus, and the latter in that of the Duke of Holstein-Gottorp, are lately arrived here. Yesterday Morning a Conference was held, as usual, among the Ministers of the Allies; but the general Conference, which was intended to have been held on the 3d with those of France, is deferred for some Days longer.
