NEW TOWNS ACT 1981

The New Town of Basildon: Extinguishment of Public Rights of Way over Steeple View Neighbourhood

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Environment in exercise of his powers under section 23 of the New Towns Act 1981 has made an Order extinguishing as from the date of the Order the public rights of way over the following rights of way, shown coloured blue on the map hereinafter referred to:

Land formerly comprising that part of Kings Road extending northwards from its junction with the Southend Arterial Road (point A on the map) for a distance of 145 feet to its junction with Kings Road and Kings Crescent (point B on the map).

Rusticana Crescent extending westwards from its junction with Barrett Grove for a distance of 175 feet and then extending northwards for a distance of 170 feet (point C on the map) and Rusticana Crescent extending eastwards from its junction with Barrett Grove for a distance of 220 feet and then extending northwards for a distance of 230 feet to point D on the map.

Barrett Grove extending northwards from its junction with the Southend Arterial Road (point E on the map) for a distance of 375 feet to its junction with Rusticana Crescent (point F on the map).

Doves Avenue extending southwards from its junction with the Southend Arterial Road (point G on the map) for a distance of 310 feet to point H on the map.

The part of Dovercourt Avenue extending northwards from its junction with Burlington Parade (point I on the map) for a distance of 800 feet to its junction with Noak Hill Road (point J on the map).
