To the *QUEEN*'s moſt Excellent Maieſty,
The humble Adreſſs of the High-Sheriff, Deputy-Lieutenants, Juſtices of Peace, Clergy, and Gentlemen of the County of Radnor.

May it pleaſe Your Maieſty,

WHEN we look back upon the uninterrupted Succeſſes of Your Maieſty's Reign, we cannot enough Adore the Divine Providence for ſuch Important Bleſſings, which lead to (the ſtill greater Effects of his Goodneſs to Your Maieſty and Your People) a Peace. Poverty and Diltreſs, the Diſmal Attendants of Fury and Rapine, have, we hope, ſufficiently abated the Pride and Ambition of any Power, which may have diſturbed the Repoſe of Chriſtendom; and 'tis a Task worthy Your Maieſty and the Engliſh Name, to point out the Season when the Sword is to be ſheathed, and in due Time to interpoſe and end the Differences of Mankind.

It is with the higheſt Joy we Your Maieſty's faithful Subjects behold You labouring in this God-like Work; and we of this County take a peculiar Satisfaction in it, in regard that our chief Town has been ſo long Reſented by that Sublime and Happy Genius in Your Maieſty's Service, who has Ability, Reſolution and Adreſs equal to ſuch arduous Undertakings.

It would be contrary to the conſtant Tenour of Your Maieſty's Glorious and Pious Life, to omit any neceſſary Proviſions for the Safety of the Church of England, its Miniſters and Communicants; and we reſt aſſured of Your Maternal Care in this Behalf, with relation to the Proteſtant Succeſſion: But that the Effect of ſuch Councils may be ſuſpended to very diſtant Years, by the continuance of Your own happy Reign over us, is the hearty Prayers of Your Maieſty's moſt Faithful and Loyal Subjects.

The following Adreſſs from the Borough of Huntingdon, was preſented to Her Maieſty by Thomas Colſers, of Conington, Eſq; being introduced by the Lord High Treafurer.

To the *QUEEN*'s moſt Excellent Maieſty,

The humble Adreſſes of ſeveral of the Aldermen, Burgeſſes, Gentlemen, and principal Inhabitants of the Borough of Huntingdon, in the County of Huntingdon.

May it pleaſe Your Maieſty,

TO permit one of Your antient Boroughs to teſtiſie their Joy with the greateſt and beſt part of Your Kingdom, upon Your Royal Proclamation for enlarging the Time for a Suſpenſion of Arms, by which ſo ſure a Proſpect is given us of an advantageous and honourable Peace.

The happy Progreſs of this Treaty, as it is matter of the greateſt Joy to Your good Subjects, ſo we find it occaſion of the utmoſt Conſolation to thoſe amongſt us, who have ſo infamouslly endeavoured to obſtrict it; and for thoſe Abroad, Succeſs ſeems to have left them, with Your Maieſty's Forces. So ſenſibly have they already found the want of Your Arms and Councils, and too late may wiſh for thoſe Advan-

tages You had procured to be offered to them: For the Almighty never fails to ſcatter the People that delight in War, nor to make good the Bleſſings he hath promiſed to the Peace-makers.

This Peace, we promiſe our ſelves, will in great meaſure Recompence the unequal Sacrifice we have made of our Blood and Treafure, and by the Enlargement of our Trade and Dominions, Poſterity may reap ſuch Advantages as will lighten that heavy Burthen which hath been laid upon them.

By Your Maieſty's Wiſdom, and the Bleſſing of God on ſo much Piety, under the Conduſt of ſo Courageous and Faithful a Miniſtry, who are neither to be terrified nor circumvented, we doubt not but to ſee a ſpeedy Concluſion of this great Work; and our utmoſt Wiſhes are, that Your Maieſty may long enjoy this Peace, in a long, a glorious, and a memorable Reign, and tranſmit it, together with Your exemplary Virtues, down to thoſe who are to Inherit Your Kingdoms after You.

Which Adreſſes Her Maieſty receiv'd very Graciouſly.

Tournay, Sept. 7. N. S. The laſt Advices we have received inform us, that Douay continues to make a very vigorous Defence, the Enemy having been ſeveral times repulſed from a half Moon, which they often attacked, but have not yet been able to carry. However Marechal Villars is ſo confident of his being ſoon Maſter of it, that he is already concerting Meaſures for ſome farther Enterprize, in order to which he has reſolved to march towards Crepin, and poſt his Right at Bavay, and his Left at Coude, with the Brook in front. With this intent he has already plac'd eight Bridges over the Scheide, above and below Valenciennes. But as this may poſſibly be only a deſign to amuſe us, ſeventeen Battalions are left in Liſle, and a competent Number will be left in this place, which may be drawn out again, if the French ſhould determine to beſiege Queſnoy, as it is ſuppoſed they will.

Gand, Sept. 9. N. S. On the 7th Inſtant Monsieur V. gelin de Claerbeigen, one of the Field Deputies of the States, came hither from the Army, and after he had been ſome time in Conſerence with the Duke of Ormond, he went through Sas van Ghend and Dendermonde to Bruſſels.

Bruiſels, Sept. 10. N. S. The Confederate Army decamped from Seclin on the 3d, and poſted it ſelf with the Right towards Bont a Bouviaes, and the Left at Ere and Froyenné near Tournay, in which Situation it was intended they ſhould remain till the Concluſion of the Siege of Douay. But all the Forage being conſumed in the adjacent Country, they broke up from thence on the 7th, and encamped that Evening at Leuſe. The next Day they advanced to Cambren, and Yeſterday towards the Haine. After having paſſed that River they encamped with the Left at Nime, and the Right at Givry, the Head Quarters being at Havre. Laſt Night Intelligence was brought to Prince Eugene, that the French Forces have taken the Camp of Crepin, but upon Information that their whole Army was not come up, he purſued his March at two this Morning, in order to endeavour to force ſome of the French Ports, and prevent the Siege of Queſnoy, which it is thought Marechal Villars will attempt after he has finiſh'd that of Douay, the Governor of which Place demanded to Capitulate on the 8th at Noon.

Utrecht, Sept. 13. N. S. Several of the Miniſters of the Allies are gone to the Hague, from whence they are expected back in a few Days. The French Plenipotentiaries have received an Expreſs from Marechal Villars, which they ſay has brought advice, that the Garrifon of Douay ſurrender'd Priſoners of War on the 8th Inſtant, and that Queſnoy was Inveſted the Day following.

Whitehall, Sept. 5. Whereas it has been maliciously inſerted in the Amſterdam Gazette of the 13th Inſtant, N. S. in the Article from London, That ſeveral Subaltern Officers belonging to Her Maieſty's Regiments lately Diſbanded, begin to rob upon the Highways; it is thought proper

to do Justice to all the Gentlemen who have served in those Corps, by publishing to the World, that upon the strictest Enquiry it does not appear that any of them have given the least Occasion for this great Scandal so injuriouly cast upon them.
