Baden Powell Road.

Park Road (west side)

From a point 20 metres south of its junction with Summerfield Road in a northerly direction for a distance of 95 metres.

From its junction with Boythorpe Avenue in a southerly direction for a distance of 20 metres.

Summerfield Road -(both sides)

-From its junction with Park Road in an easterly direction for a distance of 15 metres.

From its junction with Park Road in a westerly direction for a distance of 15 metres.

Boythorpe Avenue -(south side)

-From its junction with Park Road in a westerly direction for a distance of 20 metres.

Baden Powell Road (south side)

From its junction with Park Road in an easterly direction for a distance of 110 metres.

(ii) Waiting limited to one hour with return prohibited within two hours between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. Monday to Saturday with an exception for residents

Park Road (west side)

-From a point 67 metres north of its junction with Summerfield Road in a northerly direction to a point 20 metres south of its junction with Boythorpe Avenue.

Exemptions will be provided in the Order to enable vehicles to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle; to enable goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle; to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the roads or the services therein to take in petrol, oil or air from any garage situated within the lengths of road; or as part of a funeral or wedding cortege. The usual exemptions for disabled persons' vehicles will be provided in
