TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

The Secretary of State previously gave notice that he proposes to make an Order under Section 209 of the above Act to authorise the stopping up of highways in the vicinity of Coronation Road, Bedminster, Bristol, to enable development consisting of a new superstore and associated car part for 700 cars and road improvements to be carried out in accordance with planning permission granted to A. D. G. Property Services under Part III of the said Act.

The proposed Order will require the provision of new highway and the improvement of highways maintainable at public expense for which the Highway Authority is to be the Avon County Council.

THE IMPORTED FOOD REGULATIONS 1984

Health Mark: Canada

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food and the Secretary of State for Wales acting jointly in exercise of the powers conferred on them by the Imported Foods Regulations 1984 (SI 1984, No. 1918), give notice that they hereby recognise, subject to the conditions hereinafter set out, the health marks described in Part 1 of the Schedule hereto for the importation from Canada of meat and meat products as showing:

- (a) that the fresh meat to which they relate, or the meat from which the meat product to which they relate was prepared, was derived from mammals or birds inspected before and immediately after death and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Ministers; and
- (b) that the dressing, packing and other preparation of the fresh meat or meat product was carried out with all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to health.
1. Recognition of the health mark is extended to include:—For bovine animals: tongues and cheek meat (internal and external masseters).
 - For swine: cheek meat (internal and external masseters).
2. The said health marks are recognised subject to the following conditions:
- (i) recognition applies only to fresh meat and meat products imported from Canada but does not apply to any such meat and meat products derived from mammals or birds killed when wild.
 - (ii) where the health marks are in the form of stamps or labels, recognition will apply only if the stamps or labels have not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as a health mark.

Recognition of the health marks is restricted to the extent shown in Part 2 of the Schedule hereto.

The notices published in *The London Gazette* dated 12th November 1984 and 15th June 1984 are hereby revoked.

SCHEDULE

Part 1

(a) For fresh meat of domestic bovine animals (including buffalo), pigs, sheep, goats and solipeds the health mark shall consist of either:

- (i) A stamp or label bearing the following details within an oval surround 6.5 cm wide by 4.5 cm high:—

on the upper part:

the name CANADA in capitals or, if appropriate the set of initials approved for that country under the International Convention on Motor Vehicle Registration, viz: CDN.

in the centre:

the number of the establishment, which shall be one of those listed in Part 2 of this Schedule.

The letters must be 0.8 cm high and the figures 1 cm high.

The seal may include an indication of the Official Veterinarian who carried out the health inspection of the meat; or
