**T**HE following Address from the County of Lincoln, was presented to Her Majesty by the Honourable Philip Bertie, Esq; being introduced by the Honourable the Lord High Treasurer.

To the QUEEN's most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Address of the Lord Lieutenant, Deputy Lieutenants, High Sheriff, Grand Jury, Justices of the Peace, Clergy, Gentry, and Freeholders of Your County of Lincoln.

MADAM,

**W**HEN Your most Sacred Majesty was pleas'd to lay aside Your Royal Prerogative, to alleviate the Minds of Your good People, oppress'd with the continued Course of an unequal, expensive, and bloody War, by imparting to Your Parliament those just Measures You had already taken, and was yet transacting, to bring it to an honourable and happy End; we can do no less, on our Parts, but acknowledge Your gracious Condescensions in the same manner we read them recommended in the many dutiful Addresses of our Fellow Subjects, amongst whom, we hope, we are not too late to partake of Your Royal Favours in the acceptance hereof.

Throughout the whole course of Your Reign hitherto, Your Majesty's good Subjects have been employ'd in Congratulations for Victories obtained by Your Invincible Arms over the Common Enemy; but Peace is a greater Blessing than Victory, especially such a Peace as Your Majesty has given us a Prospect of, which has inspir'd Your Subjects with a noble Emulation, to out-do each other in their Expressions of Duty and Gratitude, to so wise, so great, so good a Queen!

We see, with Pleasure, and thankfully acknowledge Your Majesty's Care in this Treaty, to confirm to us the Succession of the Illustrious House of Hannover to these Realms, and to improve and extend our Commerce beyond its ancient Limits; a Commerce capable, in some reasonable time, to retrieve the vast Expences contributed by Your Loyal Subjects in this long and tedious Scene of War.

We feel a Joy above Expression, to see (the Earnest of our approaching Happiness) one of the strongest Fortresses in the World in Your Majesty's Possession; we admire Your wise Administration both at Home and Abroad, and pray that the God of Peace may give Success to Your Pious Endeavours to procure it, and after that, permit You to enjoy the Fruits of it in a long and prosperous Reign.

To the QUEEN's most Excellent Majesty,

May it please Your Majesty,

**W**E Your Majesty's most Dutiful and Loyal Subjects, the Magistrates and Town Council of Your Royal Burgh of Drumfries, humbly beg leave to offer our most grateful Acknowledgments for Your Majesty's Royal Condescension and Favour, in communicating to Your People the happy Progress of Your Majesty's Endeavours for procuring a general Peace upon Terms honourable to Your Majesty, for the Interest of Your Subjects, and Safety of Your Allies,

And when with the utmost Pleasure we reflect upon the Royal Expressions of Your Majesty's Concern for the Security of the Protestant Succession in Illustrious House of Hannover, with the repeated Assurances for the Maintaining the Church of Scotland as by Law Establish'd (the Security whereof being one Essential Foundation of the Union, and whole steady Loyalty to Your Majesty's Person and Government, we hope, doth entitle it to Your Care and Protection) we cannot in Gratitude be wanting to render our humble Acknowledgments.

That Your Majesty may long live to be the glorious Defender of the Protestant Religion, a powerful Supporter of the Liberties of Europe, still be under the Influence of Heaven, so as to enable Your Majesty to carry the Ballance of Europe; that Your Administrations may for ever secure to Your Majesty the Love of Your Subjects, and may Your Majesty long live in Peace, to wear a Crown here, and in the End, receive that which is immortal, are and still shall be, the earnest and fervent Prayers of, may it please Your Majesty, Your Majesty's most dutiful, faithful, and loyal Subjects.

Genoa, October 7. N. S. The Duke of Biscaccio, who has been a Prisoner in the Milanese for several Years, and is now exchanged, set out from hence a few Days ago; and having obtained a Passport of the Duke of Savoy, he is gone to Turin, from whence he intends to proceed to Madrid by the way of France. The other Neapolitan Princes who are here upon their Parole, expect likewise to be released in a short time, and have already desired a Galley of the Republick to carry them to Marseilles. On the 27th past, two British Men of War, which were in this Port, sail'd with the Admirals and other Dispatches for Spain. We have an Account from Leghorn, that several French Prizes have been lately brought in there by Dutch Privateers.

Florence, October 11. N. S. Letters from Barcelona of the 2d Instant bring Advice, that the Emperor's Forces, and those of Her Majesty, are separated, the latter being encamped between Barcelona and Tarragona, in which Situation they intend to remain till the Duke of Argyle's Arrival in those Parts, who is daily expected by the way of Toulon.

Venice, October 14. N. S. On Monday last the Council of Ten printed their Sentence against Signor John Baptist Venier, to which they have added the Promise of a Reward to any Person that kills him, Four thousand Ducats, if it be within this State, and Six thousand if in other Countries; and every Body is forbid to write to him under very severe Penalties. They say he is fled towards Holland. The Council of Ten have lately condemn'd another Nobleman, call'd Martinengo, to be beheaded publicly, for having beaten a Magistrate at Brescia in the Execution of his Office. We have received Advice, that on the 26th of the last Month the Pope held a Consistory, in which he named four new Cardinals; Monsignor Orighi, Secretary of the Consulta; Corradini, Auditor of the Pope; Pico della Mirandola, Major Domo; and Buffi, Nuntio at Cologne. The Bishop of Osimo is conferred upon the new Cardinal P. and several other Promotions have been lately made at Rome.

**Utrecht, October 28. N. S.** On the 24th the Ministers of the Allies held a Conference in the Town-house as usual, at which the Lord Privy-Seal, being indisposed, did not assist, but his Lordship is now recover'd. The same Evening Count Sinzen-dorff came lither from the Hague, to which Place he returned Yesterday, upon advice that Prince Eugene is expected there very soon. Monsieur Mellerade, one of the Plenipotentiaries of Savoy, having received Orders from the Duke his Master to repair to the Court of Great Britain, set out from hence two Days ago, intending to proceed thither by the first Opportunity. The Lord Privy-Seal had a Conference this Morning at his own House with Monsieur Buys, Plenipotentiary of the States-General, and another in the Afternoon with those of Prussia. The Regiment late of Nassau-Woudenbourg, which was garrisoned in this Town, and march'd out some time ago upon an Incurfion made by a French Party in the Neighbourhood of Nimeguen, is returned here.
