## LONDON BOROUGH OF HAVERING

London Borough of Havering—Proposed Extension to Gidea Park Controlled Parking Zone

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Havering propose to make:

- (a) the Havering (Free Parking Places) (No. 1) Order 1986 under section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984; and
- (b) the Havering (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Amendment No. 31) Order 1986 under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the above-mentioned Act of 1984.

The effect of the Orders would be to impose a system of controlled parking in the London Borough of Havering in the streets or parts of streets listed in the Schedules to this notice.

The general effect of the Free Parking Places Order would be to:

- (a) designate parking places on the streets specified in Schedule 1 to this notice in which vehicles authorised by the Order may be left for any period during the permitted hours without charge;
- (b) provide that the parking places would be in operation between 8.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Satur-days inclusive (Christmas Day, Good Friday and Bank Holidays excepted);
- (c) specify, in respect of the parking places, that passenger vehicles (12 seats or less), goods carrying vehicles, motorcycles or invalid carriages may be left therein;
- (d) provide that certain other vehicles may wait in the parking places in certain circumstances, e.g. to allow persons to board or alight, to load or unload (maximum 20 minutes), etc.

The general effect of the Waiting and Loading Restriction Order would be further to amend the Havering (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1978 so that, except in the designated parking places:

- (a) waiting by vehicles (otherwise than for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle) would be prohibited between:
  - (i) 8 a.m. and 10 a.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive in the streets and parts of streets listed in Schedule 2 to this notice;
    (ii) 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in parts of the streets listed in Schedule 3
  - to this notice;
- (b) waiting by vehicles for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle for a period of more than 20 minutes in the same place would be prohibited between 11 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in parts of the streets referred to in paragraph 4 (a) (ii) above;
- (c) in the streets and parts of streets referred to in paragraph 4 (a) above, the sale or offer for sale of goods from a vehicle would be prohibited, except on a Sunday, unless there is in force a valid licence issued by the London Borough of Havering, or the goods are immediately taken into or delivered at premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is effected;
- (d) in the streets and parts of streets referred to in paragraph 4 (a) above, the use of any vehicle or of any animal or the wearing of fancy dress or other costume, wholly or mainly for the purpose of advertising would be prohibited.

The prohibitions referred to in paragraphs 4 (a) and (b) above would not apply in respect of anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable
