**NEW TOWNS ACT 1981** 

Milton Keynes Development Corporation: Extinguishment of Public Rights of way over part of Oakhill Road, Shenley Church End.

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Environment, in exercise of his powers under section 23 of the New Towns Act 1981, has made an Order extinguishing as from the date of the Order public rights of way over the following route shown by a thick black line on the map referred to therein:

That part of Oakhill Road, Shenley Church End, from a point marked A on the map being approximately 150 metres north-east of the entrance to lawn Farm and running in a north-easterly direction for approximately 120 metres to a point marked B on the map being approximately 1-4 kilometres south-west from the junction of Oakhill Road and Shenley Road at Shenley Church End Village.

The Order is dated 30th July 1986, and a copy of it and of the map referred to in it showing the rights of way which have been extinguished may be inspected at the offices of the Milton Keynes Development Corporation, Saxon Court, 502 Avebury Boulevard, Central Milton Keynes MK9 3HS, during normal office hours.

#### Route of the Motorway

1. A route about 12.0 km (7.5 miles) in length starting at a point at the junction of the A5 Trunk Road (Watling Street) at Wilnecote in the County of Warwick and proceeding in a general north-easterly direction through the areas of Polesworth, Austrey and Appleby Magna ending at the junction of the A444 Atherstone Road and the A453 Tamworth Road at Appleby Magna in the County of Leicester being part of the route described in Schedule 1 of the M42 Birmingham-Nottingham Motorway (Curdworth to Appleby Magna Section) and Connecting Roads Scheme 1973.

#### SCHEDULE 2

#### Routes of the connecting roads

1. Junction with the A5 Trunk Road at Wilnecote. Two

routes to connect the northbound and southbound carriage-ways of the Motorway with the roundabout constructed as part of the A5 Trunk Road a Wilnecote.

2. Junctions with the A453 Trunk Road and A444 Principle Road at Appleby Magna. Two routes to connect the northbound and southbound carriageways of the Motorway with a roundabout constructed as part of the A453 Trunk Road at Appleby Magna.
