BRITISH AIRPORTS AUTHORITY

The Heathrow Airport—London (Prohibition of Driving Order 1981) (Amendment No. 6) Order 1986

Notice is hereby given that the British Airports Authority on 30th July 1986 made the above mentioned Order under sections 1(1) and (2), 2 (1) to (3), and Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, and as having effect by virtue of the Aerodrome Traffic (Heathrow) Order 1976.

The effect of this Order is to amend the Heathrow Airport—London (Prohibition of Driving) Order 1981 so that:

- (i) In Schedule 4 to the Principal Order (Prohibition of Driving—except public Service vehicles, coaches

and goods vehicles for loading and unloading of goods), after Item 3 insert as follows:

“4. The 1st and 2nd traffic lanes nearest to the Terminal 3 Departures Building in Canberra Road”.

- (ii) In Schedule 5 to the Principal Order (Prohibition of driving—except for public service vehicles, coaches, hackney carriages and goods vehicles for loading and unloading of goods):

(a) Delete Item 1 and insert “1, The 2nd traffic lane nearest to the Terminal 3 Departures Building in Canberra Road”.

(b) Delete Item 3.

A copy of the Order and a map showing the areas and roads to which the Order relates may be inspected at the Roads Administration Office, Building 216, Heathrow Airport—London between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4 p.m.

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Order, or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the power of the relevant sections of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of the provisions of the Act or of any regulations under the Act have not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
