The County of Hereford and Worcester (A448 Worcester Road, Bromsgrove) (Experimental Prohibition of Driving) Order 1986.

Notice is hereby given that Hereford and Worcester County Notice is hereby given that Hereford and Worcester County Council propose to make an Order under sections 1 (1) and (2), 2 (1) to (3) and 3 (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and of all other enabling powers, the effect of which will be to prohibit any vehicle from proceeding or waiting in that length of the A448 Worcester Road in the Town and District of Bromsgrove, in the county of Hereford and Worcester, which extends from its junction with Hanover Street for a distance of 60 metres (197 feet) in a north-easterly direction, for an experimental period of up to 18 months. up to 18 months.

Exemptions are contained in the Order for vehicles of the following classes or for the following purposes, if the

- (a) is to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police
- (b) is to be used for any building or demoltion operation, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road and the supply of gas, electricity and water and the maintenance of any telecommunications apparatus;
- (c) is a mechanical road cleansing vehicle;
- (d) is a vehicle requiring access to land or premises situated on or adjacent to the road, to which there is not a satisfactory alternative means of vehicular access:
- (e) is being used for delivering and collecting mail by Post Office vehicles.

The County Council of Isle of Wight (Various Streets, Newport/Carisbrooke, I.W.) (Traffic Regulation) Order No. 1 1986.

Notice is given that the County Council of Isle of Wight has made an Order under sections 1, 2 and 4 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 which is operative from Monday, 11th August 1986.

The effect of this is as published in 14th January 1986 issue of the London Gazette, No. 50400, ref. 728.

- (a) The draft Order has been modified in relation to the following:
 - (i) To prohibit the waiting of vehicles at any time in the following lengths of road:
 - Calbourne Road, Carisbrooke on west and south sides, from 30 feet north to 50 feet east of Nodgham Lane, to include all sides of the grass
 - Nodgham Lane, on both sides, from the junction with Calbourne Road, Carisbrooke to 25 feet west thereof.
 - (ii) To introduce no waiting 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday to Saturday restrictions in the following length of road:
 - Mount Pleasant Road, on east side, from 45 feet south of Medina Avenue to 45 feet north of Clarence Road.
- (b) The following proposals have been deleted:

To prohibit the waiting of vehicles at any time in the following lengths of road:

- Castle Road. on south-east side, from Linden Road to 45 feet north-east thereof.
- Chain Lane, on west side, from Lugley Street to 25 feet east of the western-most edge of the
- Cross Lane, on east side, from 45 feet south of Victoria Road to 90 feet south of Bellemead Lane.
- High Street, Carisbrooke, on west side, f Nodgham Lane to 30 feet north thereof.
- High Street, Carisbrooke, on south side, from Nodgham Lane to 50 feet west thereof. To include all sides of the grass triangle.
- High Street, on north side, from 35 feet east of Carisbrooke Road to 10 feet west of Mill Street.
- Hunnyhill, on east side, from 200 feet north of Worsley Road to 150 feet south of Catherine Terrace.
- Hunnyhill, on east side, from 30 feet south to 130 feet south of Banner Lane.
- Lugley Street, on north side, from Chain Lane to 60 feet west thereof.
- Mount Pleasant Road, on both sides, from 45 feet south of Medina Avenue to 45 feet north of Clarence Road.
- Priory Road, on west side, from Priory Farm Lane to 50 feet south thereof.

A copy of the Order, and relevant map, can be inspected during normal office hours in the County Secretary and Solicitor's Department at the address below.

Any person wishing to question the validity of this Order or of any of its provisions on the ground that it is not within the powers of the relevant enabling Act or that a requirement of any such enabling Act or of any relevant regulations made thereunder has not been complied with may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the Order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
