*The Hertfordshire (A4146 Leighton Buzzard Road, Hemel Hempstead) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1986*

Notice is hereby given that the Hertfordshire County Council on 13th August 1986 made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended the effect of which will be to prohibit waiting at any time

on lengths of the A4146 Leighton Buzzard Road, Hemel Hempstead, as specified in the Schedule to this notice.

The usual exemptions will apply to enable persons to board or alight, for goods to be loaded or unloaded, for disabled drivers and for vehicles engaged in maintenance, statutory duties or the emergency services.

#### KENSINGTON AND CHELSEA ROYAL BOROUGH COUNCIL

##### *Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea—Revised layout of on-street Parking Places*

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea propose to make the Kensington and Chelsea (Free Parking Places) (Disabled Persons (No. ) Order 198 , the Kensington and Chelsea (Parking Places) (No. ) Order 198 and the Kensington and Chelsea (Parking Places) (No. ) Order 198 under sections 6, 45, 46, 49 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended by the Local Government Act 1985.

The general effect of the Parking Places Orders would be to:

- revoke the designation by the Order listed in column 1 of the Schedule to this notice of the parking place allocated the number specified in column 2 of that Schedule and which is situated on the highway specified in column 3 of that Schedule;
- designate residents' parking places in Courtfield Road and Limerston Street (operational between 8.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive and between 8.30 a.m. and 1.30 a.m. on Saturdays, Christmas Day, Good Friday and Bank Holidays excepted) and provide that only vehicles displaying a valid permit and a valid season ticket issued by the Royal Borough Council may be left therein;

Season tickets cost £3 or £10.50 for solo motor cycles for tickets expiring at the end of three months and twelve months respectively and £14, £26 or £45 for all other vehicles for tickets expiring at the end of 3 months, 6 months and 12 months respectively running from the beginning of the month in which they first become valid;

- provide that certain vehicles may wait free of charge in certain circumstances, e.g., to allow persons to board or alight (maximum 2 minutes), to load or unload (maximum 20 minutes) and vehicles left by specified disabled persons (no time limit).

The general effect of the Disabled Persons' Parking Places Order would be to:

- revoke the designation by the Kensington and Chelsea (Free Parking Places) (Disabled Persons) (No. 1) Order 1985 of the disabled persons parking place in Chelsea Park Gardens;
- designate parking places in Clabon Mews, Cope Place, Courtfield Road and Limerston Street in which vehicles authorised by the Order may be left for any period during the permitted hours without charge;
- provide that the parking places would operate between 8.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive (Christmas Day, Good Friday and Bank Holidays excepted);
- specify that vehicles displaying in the relevant position a valid permit in a protective cover issued by the Council to any person whose usual place of abode or whose permanent place of work or business is at premises situated within The Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea and who fulfils certain requirements as to the degree of his disability or an Institution operating from premises situated within The Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea and which is concerned with the care of disabled persons, may be left in the parking places;
- provide that certain vehicles may wait in the parking places in certain circumstances e.g., to allow persons to board or alight (maximum 2 minutes), to load or unload (maximum 20 minutes), etc.

The restrictions imposed by the Kensington and Chelsea (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1976 would apply to any areas previously designated as parking places and not re-designated as such, as they apply in the immediate vicinity.

A copy of each of the proposed Orders, of the Kensington and Chelsea (Parking Places) Order 1967, of the Kensington and Chelsea (Parking Places) Order 1968, of the Kensington and Chelsea (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1976 and of the Kensington and Chelsea (Free Parking Places) (Disabled Persons) (No. 1) Order 1979 (and of the Orders which have previously
