- (b) alter the payment of the initial charge so that coins of the denomination of:
 - (i) 20 pence would be used at the parking places referred to in (a), (c) and (d) of the Schedule to this notice;
 - (ii) 10 pence and/or 20 pence would be used at the parking places referred to in (b) and (e) of the Schedule to this
- (c) increase the excess charge at all metered parking places so that it would be £6.
