and Earl Mortimer, Lord High Treasurer of Great
Britain: and Thomas Farl of Strafford. One of Her Britain; and Thomas Earl of Strafford, One of Her Majesty's Ambassadors-Plenipotentiary at Utrecht, and first Lord Commissioner of the Admiralty, were Elected Knights Companions of the said most Noble Order, having been first Introduced into the Chapter (except his Grace the Duke of Thomassadors).
