The County of Durham (Unclassified Road, The Peth, Durham City) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1986

Notice is hereby given that the Durham County Council have made an Order under sections 1 (1) and (2), 2 (1) to (3) and 4 (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the Order which comes into operation on 27th August 1986 will be to prohibit the waiting by vehicles at any time on any day on the sides of road specified in the Schedule hereto.
