### DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORT

#### TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that on the application of the Derby City Council, he proposes to make an Order under section 212 of the above

Act to provide for the extinguishment of any right which persons may have to use vehicles on parts of Somerset Street and Cowsley Road, Chaddesden, Derby.

The proposed Order will contain provisions for permitting the use of those highways by vehicles being used:

(a) for police, ambulance or fire brigade purposes;

(b) in connection with the laying, erection, inspection, maintenance, alteration, repair, renewal or removal in or near the said length of highway of any sewer, main, pipe, conduit, wire, cable or other apparatus for the supply of gas, water, electricity or of any telecommunication apparatus as defined in Schedule 2 to the Telecommunications Act 1984 and for use by pedal cyclists.
