Genoa, Odober 23. N. S. to Prince Livio Odescalchi, who intends in a short. time to fet out for Naples, where he is to be Installed by the Viceroy, together with the Prince St. Severino, and another Neopolitan Grandee, likewife created Knights of the fame Order. Letters from Naples bring an Account, that feveral Malecontents have been lately Argefted there, and the Prince of Bifaccia was fent for out of the Country, being fulpected of forming fome Defigns against the Government. The Conful of Raguía hath made the Viceroy the usual Prefent in the Name of that Republick, which is done every Year as an acknowledgment for the Protection they enjoy from the Kings of Naples.

Berlin, November 5. N.S. Lieutenant-General Arnheim, who commanded his Majefty's Troops in Italy; is expected here very foon; and it is faid Lieurenant-General Finck is to fucceed him in the Command of those Forces. Monsieur Abefeld, the Danish Envoy at this Court, intends to set out for Copenhagen in a few Days.

Hanover, Nov. 8. N. S. The Elector has fent Orders to Monsseur Bu o, his General in Flanders, to march homewards with the Troops of his Electoral Highness, that had been in British Pay, but as these Instructions were given only upon Account of some Difficulties arilen about their Winter Quarters, it is not yet known whether they are to return. We are inform'd by Letters from Pomerania, that the Swedes at Stralfund, have extended their Quarters as far as Damgarden, which has fo alarm'd the Da-nish Garrison at Rostock, that they kept the Gates of the Town shut for three Days. The Muscovites have quitted the Blockade of Stetin, and join'd their Army near Stralfund, that they may be the better able to refift the Swedes, ih cafe they fhould attack

them, as they give out they intend to do.' Utrecht, Nov. 11, N. S. The Plenipotentiaries of Portugal, have Sign'd a Treaty with those of France, for a Ceffation of Arms by Sea and Land, for four Months, to commence the r5th Inflant. This Morn-ing the Count de Tarduca went to the Hague, from whence Prince Eugene is expected here the next Week.
