CERTIFICATES OF TAX DEPOSITS (SERIES 6)

On and after 22nd September 1986 the rates of interest applicable to deposits accepted under the Prospectus (Series 6) dated 11th October 1982 will be as follows:

(a) for deposits of £100,000 or over:

held for	applied in settlement of a scheduled liability	withdrawn for cash
under 1 month	9½ per cent	5½ per cent
1 but less than 3 months	9½ per cent	5½ per cent
3 but less than 6 months	10 per cent	5½ per cent
6 but less than 9 months	10½ per cent	5½ per cent
9 to 12 months	10½ per cent	5½ per cent

in the relevant year of the interest period

(b) for deposits of less than £100,000: 9½ per cent if the deposit is applied in payment of a scheduled liability and 5½ per cent if the deposit is withdrawn for cash.

For deposits made under the earlier Prospectus (Series 5) which reach the fourth anniversary of the deposits in accordance with the terms and conditions set out therein: 10½ per cent if the deposit is applied in payment of a scheduled liability, and 5½ per cent if the deposit is withdrawn for cash. The Trunk Road (A483) (Llandoverly, Dyfed) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1986

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971, SECTION 209

The Stopping up of Highways (Access Road to the Rear of Dunraven Street, Tonypany, Rhondda, Mid Glamorgan) Order 1986.

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he has made the above Order under section 209 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 to authorise the stopping up of the highway described in the Schedule to this notice to enable development to be carried out.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the above Act or that any requirement of that Act or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks of 25th September 1986, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.
