of Perfoils, Degrees, Sex and Time, from the Adion | and Right of fucceeding to the Crown of France : And I Will and Confent for me and my faid Posterity, that from this time for evermore, the same be held to be paffed away and transferr'd to fuch Perfon as, through my and their being excluded, difabled and incapasitated, shall be next in Succeffion, and immediately after the King, by whose Death a vacancy shall happen; and the Succession to the faid Crown of France, ought to be fettled upon and yielded to bim, in whatever Time and Cafe it shall fall out; to have and to hold the fame as lawful and true Successor, in the fame manner as if I and my Posterity had not been Born, or in Being in this World; for that We were to be confidered and reputed as fuch, to the end that neither in my Person nor in Theirs, any Foundation may be found or had for an altive or pallive Reprefentation, beginning or continuation of a Line effective, or containing any Substance, Blood or Quality, or any Posterity may be derived, or any Redigree from the Perfons of the Most Christian King my Lord and Grandfather, or the Lord Dauphin my Father, or the glorious Kings their Pro-genitors, or to any other effect, for entring into the Succession, or anticipating the degree of Kindred, or excluding from it the Person who, as is abovementioned, shall be next in Succession. I Will and Consent for my Self, and for my Poste-rity, that from this time forth for evermore, this Right fhall be looked upon and confidered as paf-£ fed away and transferred to the Duke de Berry • my Brother, and bis Iffue and Posterity, Male-• born, in constant lawful Wedlock; and in Default of his Isue-Male to the Duke of Orleans my Unkle, and to bis Sons and Posterity Male-born, • in constant lawful Wedlock; and in Default of s bis Issue to the Duke de Bourbon my Cousin, and to bis Sons and Posterity Male-born, in constant lawful Wedlock, and fo on fuccessively to all the
Princes of the Blood of France, their Sons and 6 Posterity, Male, for ever, according to the Place and Order in which they may be called to the Crown by virtue of their Birth right, and confe-quently to fuch of the faid Princes as (upon the £ ٤ * forementioned Exclusion, Disability and Incapacity of me and all my faid Posterity) may bappen to be ¢ s next in degree, immediately after fuch King by make Death the Commediately after fuch King by whofe Death the Crown of France should become vacant, and to whom the Succession may belong, ٤ at whatever Time and in whatever Cafe the fame ¢ may bappen, that be may enjoy it as lawful and true £ Successor, in the same manner as if I and my Posterity had not been born'. And as a Confirmation of the greater validity of the Ast of Abdication of all the Right and Title that might avail me, and all my Posterity; in regard to the said Succession to the Crown of France, I depart and design particularly from that which might be derived to me from the Right of Naturalization, by the Letters Pa-tents or Instrument by which the King, my Grandfather, preferved and referved to me, and enabled me to enjoy a Right of Succeeding to the Crown of France, which Infrument was dispatch'd at Verfailles in the Month of December, in the Year 1700, and passed, approved and register'd by the Parliament; and I Will that it shall not serve for a Foundation to the Purposes for which it was intended; and I refute, and renounce it, and declare it null, void, and of none effect and cancell'd, and as if no fuch instrument had ever been executed. And I promise and oblige my felf on the Faith and Word of a King, that in whatever depends on me and my faid Children and Posterity that are and shall be, I will procure the Observation and Accomplishment of this Writing, without permitting or confenting that any thing be done to the contrary, directly or indirectly, in the whole or in part; and I defift and depart from all and whatever Remedies, known or unknown, ordinary or extraordinary, and that either of common Right or particular Priviledge might avail me and my Children, and Pofferity, to reclaim, affert, or

alledge any thing against the fame ; and I reno unce them all, and especially that of the evident Lesion, enormous and most enormous, which may be looke upon to have been in the quitting Claim, and renouncing the Right of being able to fucceed at any time to the faid Crown. I Will that none of the faid Remedies, nor any other of whatever Number, Efficacy, Importance or Quality they be, may avail or be of any use to us. And if in Falt, or under any Colour we should attempt to feige the said King-dom by force of Arms, or should make an Offen-sive or Defensive War against it, that from this present time, and in all time to come, it be judged and declared Unlawful and Unjust, and wrongfully Undertaken, by Violence, Invalion and Usurpation; against Reason and Conscience; and on the contrary, that may be judged and called Just, Lawful and Allowable, which shall be made or under-taken in behalf of him, who, by the exclusion of Me and my faid Children and Posterity, is to fucceed to the faid Crown of France, whom his natural Subjects are to receive and to obey him, and to yield and swear to him the Oath of Homage and Fealty, and to ferve bim as their law-ful King and Lord : And this quitting Claim Mind Renunciation for Me and my faid Children and Poferity is to continue firm that and and Posterity, is to continue firm, stable, valid and irrevocable for ever, and in all times to come: And I affert and promife, that I have not made nor will make any Protestation, or Reclaiming publickly or privately to the contrary hereof, which might hinder or lesen the validity of what is con-tained in this Writing; and that if I should make annea in this writing; and that if I pould make any, tho' it wre upon Oatb, it fhall not be valid or of any force or effect. And for the greater validity and certainty of what is contained in this Renunciation, and of what I therein affort and promife on my Part. I do again engage my Royal Faitb and Word, and I folemnly Swear by the Gospels contained in this Milfal on which I lay my Right Hand 5 That I mill phoence maintain my Right Hand, ' That I will observe, maintain and fulfil this Act and Instrument of Renunciaboth for me and all my Susceffors, Heirs · tion, . and Posterity in all the Clauses therein contained, according to its most natural, literal and plain ' Meaning and Construction'. And that from this Oath, I will not demand to be releas'd, and if it be by any particular Person demanded or granted of their own Motion, I will not make any Use or Advantage of it, but in case the same should be granted, I smear another like Oath, That I [hould will always preferve and maintain this One, against all Dispensations that might be granted me. And I execute this Writing before this present Secretary, Notary of this my Kingdom, and Sign the fame, and caufe it to be fealed with my Royal Seal.
